

# DEBT PROBLEM TO BE SOLVED

## Painleve Sees Agreement by November

## France Anxious to Effect Settlement, Then Will Desire New Loan

PARIS, July 22.—Premier Painleve believes France will come to a settlement of her debt problem with America before the first of November.

He revealed this in an exclusive interview with the United Press at the war ministry. He also confirmed that France hopes to obtain a loan in America after the debt funding negotiations are concluded. As for the safety pact, the premier suggested its value would be "powerfully increased if the United States could participate or cooperate."

Surrounded by maps of Morocco, the premier gave a full, frank statement of his views.

"France," he said, touching the debt problem first, "has the very firm intention to come to a settlement with the United States. There will be a settlement before the first of November. It is possible that Finance Minister Caillaux will go to the United States and arrange the settlement if American public opinion desires him."

Remarking on past American suggestions that France was seeking to repudiate her debt, Painleve observed:

"I want to say that no leader of the French government ever entertained such an idea.

"We want to discuss with the United States the term of settlement and hear the American suggestions on terms.

**Must Give Time**  
He said semi official conversations looking toward an arrangement were proceeding and that soon the official conversations would start.

France, he confirmed, will seek a great loan in the United States after the debt settlement.

"We hope," he continued, "that America will see her way to aid France in traversing the rough path between the financial difficulties which are very urgent and which can be overcome only if France is given time and opportunity to put into play the powerful resources of the country."

Turning then to the security pact negotiations, Painleve declared that France wants to wipe out war's rancor and reestablish peace in Europe. After expressing his view that America's participation in the pact would strengthen it, the premier added:

"I would like it known in America that France is so free from imperialistic designs that she could only accept with the greatest enthusiasm the intervention and cooperation of the United States in international affairs because she knows that America is inspired by the same humanitarian intentions herself."

## Chehalis Marshal Is Freed When Self Defense Shown

CHEHALIS, Wash., July 22.—After a short deliberation Tuesday night a coroner's jury exonerated J. W. Donahue, marshal of Peel of the shooting Saturday night of Bert Goins.

# SCOPES TRIAL APPEAL BEGINS

## Will Ask More Anti-evolution Laws

## Bryan Announces He Will Start Drives for Legislation in Seven States

DAYTON, Tenn., July 22.—While Dayton relapsed into its wonted tranquility and its hosts of visitors melted away, the Scopes case started on its way to the United States supreme court along two broad avenues.

Sooner or later, probably within 18 months, that tribunal will hand down a decision on the validity of the Tennessee anti-evolution law, which alone was at stake in the historic proceedings just ended.

Meanwhile, drives for anti-evolution laws will be started in at least seven states as soon as their legislatures convene, according to a statement given to the United Press by William Jennings Bryan.

Upon the ultimate decision of the supreme court will depend the success or failure of these laws and of the fundamentalist campaign to root the evolution theory out of American schools.

The Scopes case itself will go to the Tennessee supreme court at

Knoxville for hearing at its September session. If this court upholds it, it will travel thence to Washington. If it overrules it, the issue still will go to Washington through a parallel proceeding in the federal court which was started before the trial here began.

### Charge Interference

The attack through the federal court will travel via the United States court of appeals at Cincinnati. It is based upon two bills, one by Scopes alleging that the Tennessee law deprives him of his property right as a teacher "without due process of law"; the other is by Robert M. Wilson, a taxpayer of Tennessee, alleging unconstitutional interference with the education of his children.

Legal opinion here seems to hold that the outlook for a reversal of the anti-evolution law by the United States supreme court is dubious, despite the professed optimism of the defense staff.

The best chance of knocking the law out, according to informed opinion, is in the supreme court of Tennessee on a technicality, such as the alleged constitutional difference between the caption and body of the act. This, to be sure, would not be the victory for which the defense fought here, but it would give time for anti-fundamentalists to organize, while a new law was being drafted.

Defense attorneys were still busy today removing legal debris to clear the path for the upward march of the case to higher courts.
