

# Changes in Boxing Championship Titles Come Rapidly

## JINX CARRIED BY ROSENBERG

### Bantam Crown Passes Frequently

(U. P. Leased Wire to The Bend Bulletin)  
 NEW YORK, July 22.—Seven boxing title changes have taken place this year and an eighth may be recorded tonight when Eddie Kline, the stocky little Italian, meets Charley Rosenberg, who is defending the bantamweight title for the first time in a championship match.

Retirement caused a change in two titles when Benny Leonard and Johnny Dundee forfeited their crowns. Pancho Villa's death caused a vacancy in the flyweight championship and the others passed on in the orthodox fashion of getting a felling.

Rosenberg will have to carry a jinx that has been attached to the bantamweight title in recent years. The title has changed seven times in the past five years and Eddie Martin who presided over Rosenberg, lost the championship the first time he defended it.

Pete Herman beat Kid Williams in 1920 and Joe Lynch took it away from Herman. Herman retained the title and lost it again in a year to Johnny Buff, who held it less than a year and was beaten by Lynen. Abe Goldstein then beat Lynch, and within a year Goldstein was beaten by Eddie Martin and Rosenberg then beat Martin.

Chicago money has been sent in to back Kline and it is possible that he will be an even money choice when he enters the ring.

If the law of averages amounts to anything in boxing, Rosenberg ought to retain the title, but if the jinx continues to work against the bantam champions, there may be a new champion tomorrow.

The contest, which is to be a 15 rounds to a decision bout, will be staged for a Jewish relief fund in the Velodrome.

Several writers who have always defended the champion, turned against him and charged that he was deliberately running away from Harry Wills and they predicted that he would not return to New York.

Last night when one of the "weeklies" at a Broadway movie house showed Dempsey on the ship, returning from Europe with Estelle Taylor, the house gave it a generous hearing. Dempsey was captioned as "the prominent movie actor."
