

MOTHER PERSUADES BANDIT TO CONFESS

Story of Killings Secured by Devout Irish Woman

(U. P. Leased Wire to The Bend Bulletin) ST. LOUIS, July 24.—Maury O'Flaherty, a 19 year old product of St. Louis' famous old Kerry Patch—where gang wars and street feuds once raged—is in jail awaiting trial as a murder accessory as a result of the preachings a parish priest taught his mother in "ould Ireland."

The mother, Bridget O'Flaherty, today is a sad eyed yet devout mother who believes she is "bearing her cross" as the priest taught her to. For she made her son confess to being a bandit.

It is the first time in the history of St. Louis' poldemon that a mother pleaded with her son to admit being a killer. While the son didn't do the killing, he has admitted being a member of the bandit gang which shot to death Patrolman John Grogan and Harvey Hammett. Grogan, by the way, at one time rocked little Maury O'Flaherty to sleep—but that was in the days before the new horde took possession of Kerry Patch.

Mother Got Confession The mother single handedly obtained a confession from Maury after police methods had failed. Her story of obtaining the confession:

"His blue eyes looked up at me pitifully when I went to his bedside at the hospital. I said to him, 'Maury, my boy, what have you done? They say you shot our old friend Johnny Grogan.' A tear rolled down his cheek and he said, 'Mother, I didn't do it.'"

"I sat down by the bed and stroked his fevered head and implored him to tell the truth to ease his conscience. 'Son,' I said, 'remember the Lord says if your sins are as numerous as the sands of the sea they shall be forgiven.' Maury told me then and I told him to tell the officers, too, to ease his conscience and mine, too."

NEW YORK, July 24.—Bench management may become an obsolete institution of major league baseball in another year if Rabbit Maranville does as well with the Chicago Cubs as Rogers Hornsby did with the St. Louis Cardinals and Eddie Collins with the Chicago White Sox.

When Bill Kilbuck was relieved as the manager of the Cubs there remained as bench managers only John McGraw, Jack Hendricks and Art Fletcher in the National league and Connie Mack, Miller Huggins and Leo Pohl in the American league.

Four years ago a playing manager was so unusual that he could be advertised as a gate attraction. Now a manager who directs the team from the bench is the rarity.

Chicago's experiment in handing over the Cubs to the Rabbit will be interesting to watch both from a purely technical standpoint and from a psychological view.

The Rabbit, as a player off the field, was always rather difficult to handle. He didn't pay much attention to training rules and he had frequent tussles with John Law in Boston and in Pittsburgh. He is certainly fitted technically to manage a club and the added responsibility of management with the promise of

"I am bearing my cross now but I do not whimper. It is the will of God and His will be done."

"Maury is not a snitch. No good Irishman snitches. But I told him this time that self preservation is the first law of nature. I asked him on bended knees to make his peace with God and trust in the Virgin Mary."

And so Maury will go on trial with the confession—which his mother obtained—as the chief evidence against him.

Blow From Plank Is Fatal, Family of Seven Survive

The body of John M. Hayes, 53 years of age, who died at the Lumberman's hospital July 22 as the result of injuries received when he was hit in the abdomen by a plank thrown from a plane, was shipped this morning to Boise, Idaho, for burial. Hayes was injured July 21 when working at the Shevlin-Hixon mill. He is survived by a wife and six children, residents of Boise. Hayes had been in Bend for only 21 days prior to his death.

DEATH OF OFFICER AVENGED BY STATE

John Connolly' Protests Innocence of Murder

(U. P. Leased Wire to The Bend Bulletin) STATE PENITENTIARY, Folsom, Cal., July 24.—John Connolly, 38, was hanged here today for the murder of Patrolman Francis Heenan of Marysville.

The trap was sprung at 10:05 a. m. and Connolly was pronounced dead at 10:22 a. m.

Connolly went to his death bravely.

Protesting his innocence to the very last, the condemned man walked up the fatal 13 steps and took his place over the trap at 10:05 without a falter.

As the black cap was drawn over his face the muscles of his body seemed to contract. His hands clenched tightly as he steeled himself for the end.

A few minutes later the prison doctors pronounced him dead.
