STOCK MARKET GAINS RAPIDLY

General List Trails High
Priced Industrials

(Wall Street Journal Financial Review)
NEW YORK, July 24.—Further pronounced buoyancy was displayed in today's market under the stimulus of rapid advances in Mack Truck, American Can, General Railway Signal and other high priced industrials.

The general list showed a good position, but considerable selling developed in stocks such as American Locomotive, Baldwin and Pan-American. Uncertainty developed over the dividend action of the Baldwin directors, inasmuch as the company has been operating at a deficit. However, the usual July payment was made July 1.

Mack Truck entered the 200 class at the start of trading. Unusual gains were scored by other industrials. Professional selling developed and irregularity marked the afternoon's first hour. Frisco Common's rise to a record high was a feature. The market closed irregular. Closing prices included:

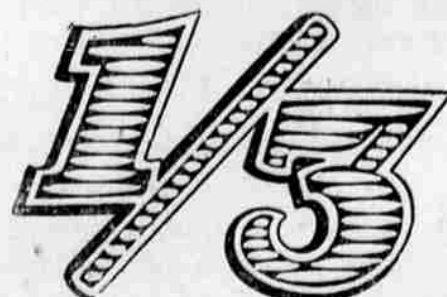
