Excavations Completed In Old Indian Village

THE DALLES, Ore., July 25.—William Duncan Strong and W. Esbert Schenck, anthropologists of the University of California, who have been at Spedis, the Wishram Indian village, for the last month, digging in Walkemup mound, were leaving here today for Albany, Oregon, where they expect to probe into the interior of a mound near there.

With many important discoveries to their credit, the researchers were exhibiting an agate maul, which they found at the base of a third Indian village at Walkemup mound, and which they believed to be very rare. They dug three trenches from the top of the mound, two east and west and one connecting trench north and south, discovering evidences of at least 20 dwellings dating back probably several hundred years.
