

PROHI CHANGES ARE ANNOUNCED

New Schedule Goes Into Effect In September

Twenty-four Administrators of Board of Strategy to Be Selected Next

 WASHINGTON, July 25.—The plan for revision of prohibition districts under the new reorganization project was announced today by Acting Secretary of the Treasury Winston.

Simultaneously, Winston made known that the new schedule would not be put into effect until September 1, in order to complete administrative details so that the machinery may operate smoothly at the start.

The changes in the eight out of 24 regions were made upon recommendation of Internal Revenue Commissioner Blair, solely for administrative reasons, Winston said.

The next step will be selection of the 24 administrators by the board of strategy. It is proposed to announce the directors when all or nearly all have been selected.

Under each administrator there will be a group head where practical in every judicial district and located in the same cities as the United States district attorney.

Under the regional director, the group head will be responsible for enforcement in his district.

Employees Given Notice

Following Winston's announcement, General L. C. Andrews, assistant secretary of the treasury, made public a letter sent to all field employees of the prohibition unit, advising them that all unclassified employees will be dismissed not later than October 15, unless reappointed under the new de-centralization plan.

Andrews said it was the intention of the department to select men from districts wherever possible and selections would be for merit only.

"Wherever the process of reorganization is under way the present organization will continue to function," Andrews wrote.

"With the advice of Commissioner Blair, Commissioner Haynes and the heads of the Washington divisions, the department will select the 24 administrators. These administrators will then go to their respective districts to study conditions of personnel with a view to selecting such organization as conditions warrant."

Vanderbilt, and Frederic Cameron Church, Jr.

Cliques and clans of aristocracy, headliners on the social pages of America, were well represented at the hotels and mansions of Newport and a selected list of 250 of the most absolutely "Who's Who" were invited to attend the ceremony.

To many who attended the wedding in the flower banked drawing room of the Vanderbilt home, piquancy was added to the impressiveness of the occasion by the fact that the bride's father and mother, who have lived apart for many years, effected a temporary reconciliation to be present together at their daughter's nuptials.

The bride had been brought up a Catholic, but the Episcopal marriage service was selected. Bishop Shipman, assisted by Rev. Stanley G. Hughes, was the officiating clergyman.

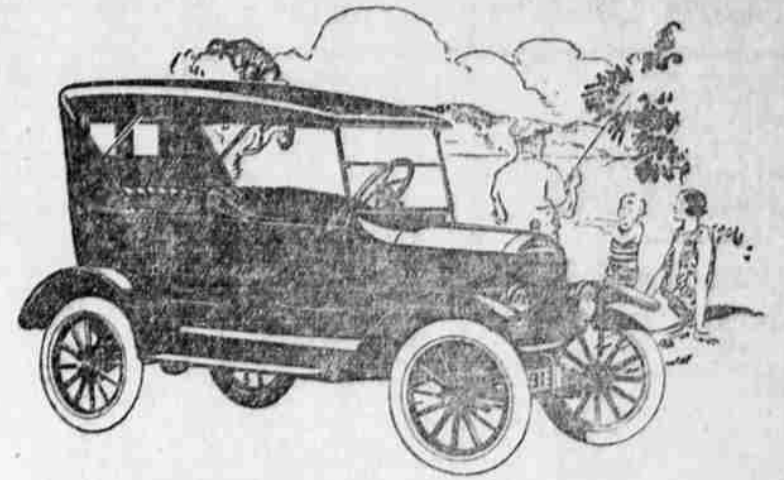

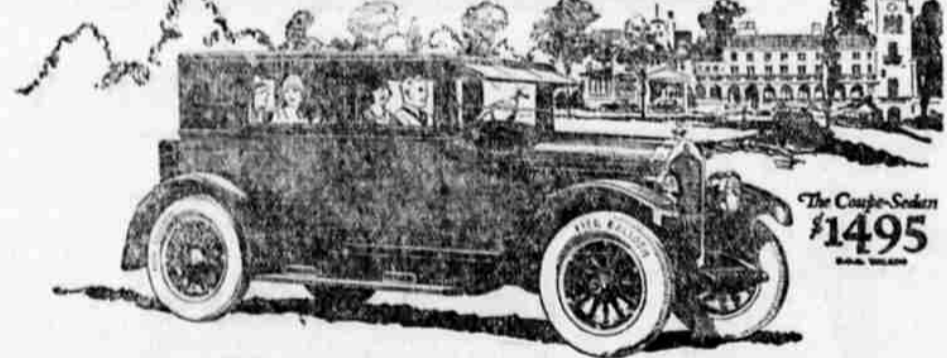

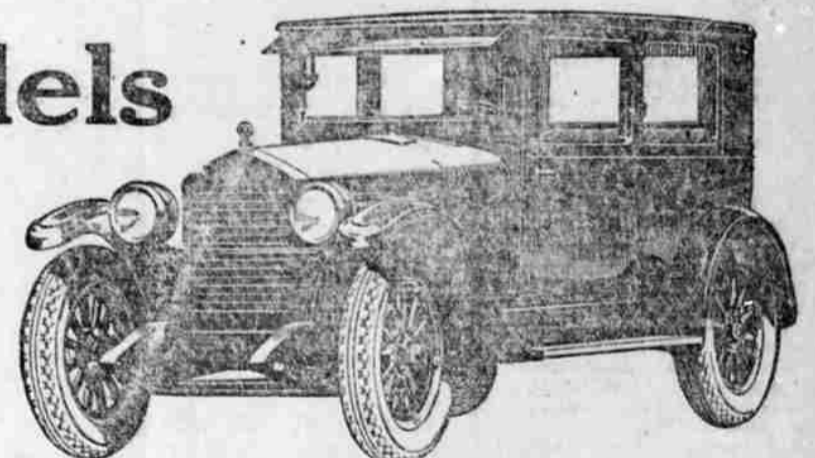
