STOCKS HOLD STRONG PRICE

Motor Issues Show Substantial Gains

NEW YORK, July 25.—Stocks maintained characteristics of an aggressive bull swing in the brief session which closed the week. Vigorous operations for the rise went ahead in many sections of the list, with fresh groups taking increased prominence in the constructive demonstration. Motor shares which had been held back recently by professional working for a decline, were taken in hand and rushed upward on the report that General Motors would pay extra dividends this year amounting to \$4 in addition to the regular \$5 dividend.

Substantial advances occurred in that stock, the Pierce-Arrow issues, Studebaker, Chrysler and Mack Truck.

Frisco common continued its advance into record territory, and new highs in the movement were reported by various industrial specialties. Week end profit taking created considerable irregularity in the late trading, but offerings were well absorbed and the market as a whole continued to display a confident tone.
