**Post Mortem Ordered For Magazine Writer**

DENVER, Aug. 1.—Upon a chemist's report to be made Monday will rest whatever action may be taken in the mysterious death of James Smith Hoy, veteran pioneer and farm magazine writer. Hoy died last May, 78 years of age. Thursday his body was exhumed and an analysis of his viscera ordered. The coroner who ordered the body exhumed said it was done upon the orders of Adea A. Hoy, 72, St. Louis, only living brother.

The cause for the action has not been revealed here as officials are awaiting the outcome of the analysis. It was learned that Hoy left an estate estimated at \$16,500. Those named in his will were Mrs. Herta Wilcox, a friend; Ada Whitaker, Bakgr, Ore.; Nova Richardson, a niece, and Val S. Hoy, a nephew, of Salt Lake City.

**MacMillan Ships Escape From Northern Ice Jams**

WASHINGTON, Aug. 1.—The MacMillan expedition ships Peary and Bowdoin have broken through the ice jam which has held them for several days and have navigated from Cape York to Cape Atholl, a distance of about 25 miles, according to a message received at the National Geographic society today.

The message was picked up by an amateur at Pittsfield, Mass., and was dated July 31. It indicated that the progress was made late yesterday.

**BEANS MAY TELL MAN'S IDENTITY**

**Examine Stomach for a Trace of Last Meal**

**Supposed Scientist Too Badly Disfigured by Explosion to be Certain**

(U. P. Leased Wire to The Bend Bulletin)  
MARTINEZ, Cal., Aug. 1.—Upon an examination of the stomach contents of the body identified as that of Charles Henry Schwartz, found burned in his laboratory near here, depends action by authorities on the theory that the body may not be that of Schwartz, it developed here today.

Schwartz's last meal was known to have included cucumbers and beans. If analysis is able to determine these foods present in the stomach, identification will be complete. Otherwise, it was said, a whole new inquiry will have to be started to seek the motives lack of the mysterious explosion and death.

Determination upon the autopsy came after Walnut Creek business men, where Schwartz's cellulose factory was located, told authorities the skull formation of the body found in the laboratory was dissimilar to that of Schwartz.

Mrs. Schwartz is equally positive that the body is that of her husband. She based identification on two pivot teeth found beside the body, saying Schwartz had three such teeth.

E. S. Bell, Oakland, attorney for Mrs. Schwartz, declares the chemist was murdered, citing a strange hat in the room and blood stains in a nearby closet as proof.

The murder theory gained further strength from the fact that the body was reclining on the floor, with a tarpaulin under the head.

Dr. A. H. Ruedy, Oakland, who had treated Schwartz in the past, identified the body positively as that of the chemist. For purposes of official record he agreed to furnish District Attorney A. B. Tinning with a complete written statement of his reasons for the identification.

**Three Sisters Area Map Completed by Dr. Dodge**
