

# English Channel Again Defeats Efforts Of Swimmers

## FRENCH GIRL THROWN BACK

### World War Hero, Too, Is Beaten Mile Away

(U. P. Leased Wire to The Bend Bulletin)  
DOVER, Aug. 5.—Beaten by the tide and by waters of the English Channel, Lieutenant Colonel Bernard Cyril Freyberg, V. C., was forced to abandon an attempt to swim from France to England today within a mile and a half of his goal.

At one time, Colonel Freyberg, a world war hero who was nine times wounded and won many decorations at Gallipoli, was within a mile of the east coast of Dover.

Shortly after the British officer began his attempt, Miss Jane Sloan, Frenchwoman, who started to swim from this New Tuesday morning, was forced to give up, only three kilometers from Dover, overcome with cold.

She had succeeded in establishing a record for women attempting the Channel swim.

Miss Gertrude Ederle, American champion, now is expected to start on her attempt to swim the channel from Gris Nez to Dover next Saturday morning, if weather conditions are favorable. Miss Lillian Harrison, Argentine swimmer, who twice has failed, may start simultaneously.

**REGARD BRITISH ADMIRALTY TUG "LANGDON" OFF DOVER**

England, Aug. 5.—The difficulties that will confront Gertrude Ederle when the American girl attempts to swim the English channel were observed in detail by a United Press correspondent who accompanied Lieutenant Colonel Bernard Cyril Freyberg, when that gallant British officer failed by a few hundred yards to accomplish the feat today.

When finally he gave up, exhausted in the chilly waters, it was at a point a mile and a half from shore, with the tide bearing him back towards France.

Colonel Freyberg, who is 35, is the man who won the V. C. at Gallipoli by blocking his naked body, swimming ashore in the darkness and penetrating the Turkish lines. He also won the D. S. C. and was wounded nine times. So when he plunged into the surf off Gris Nez on the French coast shortly after 8 o'clock last night, it was with every hope of success.

Mrs. Freyberg and P. Miller, the colonel's trainer, brothers officers and the United Press correspondent, kept pace with the swimmer in the admiralty tug. Now and then one of the party would dip over the side and swim alongside, setting the proper stroke for Colonel Freyberg.

**Plan Exploration Flight To be Started Thursday**

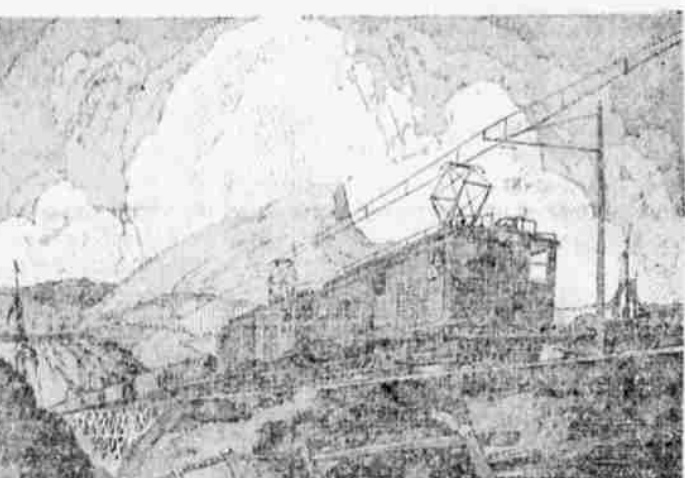
### Doctor Injects Blood To Save Logger's Life

ASTORIA, Ore., Aug. 5.—A part of his own blood was included as part of the professional services accorded B. Perram, 22, Portland logger, at St. Mary's hospital here last night by his physician, Dr. A. G. Allen. Perram was crushed between two logs while at work at the Tidewater Timber Company camp near here last Monday.

He suffered a ruptured liver and was brought to the local hospital in a serious condition. Last night, about midnight, he heaved at the pole of death. An immediate blood transfusion was imperative. "The right types" for a blood transfusion are hard to find at that hour. After hurried tests made of the blood of night watchmen and internes at the hospital, Dr. Allen finally found that only his own blood was suitable. Another physician was called in and the operation performed. Perram's condition was better this morning.
