

SCOTT INSANE, LIFE IS SAVED

Infirmity Guards Slayer of Clerk

Death Penalty Inoperative Under Illinois Law Un- less Balance Restored

CHICAGO, Aug. 7.—Russell Scott's relatives and friends have saved him from the gallows.

The former millionaire, convicted of murdering a drug clerk and twice saved from execution within a few hours of the time set for the springing of the trap, has been declared insane.

A jury in Judge Joseph B. David's court, after listening to testimony and legal wrangling for four days, decided late yesterday that Scott's life should be spared on the ground of insanity and the prisoner will be sent to the Chester asylum.

Under the law, if Scott recovers his reason, the death penalty must be executed, but no person in a similar case has ever been hanged.

Scott emerged from his terrific ordeal with little show of emotion. His wife, Mrs. Catherine Scott, her face etched with lines of grief, paced the

floor of the court room and corridors almost all of the three and a half hours that the jury was deliberating. With her was Russell's mother, a large and matronly woman, who had difficulty maintaining composure. Thomas Scott, the father, sat apart most of the time, mostly in thought. Morbidly curious men and women kept the vigil in the dimly lighted court room. Shortly before the jury was brought in, word came to the family group that a verdict of insanity had been reached.

Russell's wife sat tense as the jury filed in. When the clerk read the verdict, declaring that Scott became a lunatic or "insane," after February 1, 1925, Mrs. Scott stumbled forward and tears of relief flowed freely.

Dismiss Booze Charge When Warrant Lacking

Entrance was also made by the window, Bennett said Kletzing informed him.

"You were lucky you weren't shot," was the recorder's comment to the league officer.

GUARDIANSHIP IS QUESTIONED

Adoption by Millionaire May Be Ended

Whereabouts of Younger Child Taken Under Rich Man's Wing Is Mystery

NEW YORK, Aug. 7.—Whether little Mary Spas is to wear the cinderella slipper or whether her coach and dream of luxury are to be smashed, may be decided at a conference between Bird S. Coler, commissioner of public welfare, and District Attorney Richard Newcombe of Queens county today.

The fitness of Edward W. Browning, 59 year old millionaire, to serve as guardian of the girl he recently adopted will be considered when Coler and Newcombe meet this afternoon, according to the commissioner. It has been established that her age is 21, not 16 as at first supposed. Cinderella race.

Facts surrounding the presentation of two \$500 checks which Browning admits he gave Mr. and Mrs. John Spas, Mary's parents, also would be sought, Coler said.

According to District Attorney Newcombe, Mrs. Nellie Adelle Browning, divorced wife of the millionaire, has agreed to aid him in any way possible in the investigation of the cinderella race.

In connection with the conference scheduled for today, Commissioner Coler issued a formal statement which read:

"Owing to publicity given this matter and the question of public morals involved in this case and because of certain definite facts presented to me, I feel it my duty as commissioner of public welfare of the city of New York to ask the corporation counsel to bring a proceeding in my official capacity to intervene in these adoption proceedings for the purpose of opening up a hearing to determine whether Browning is a fit man to be given the guardianship of a minor."

Girl Is Found

Twelve year old Sarah Mullen, runner up in the Cinderella race, was found at home and in bed today after police had traced her from Browning's Manhattan office to Kew Gardens Inn on Long Island, where the millionaire and his newly adopted daughter are staying.

Sarah's mother reported to the police at midnight that her daughter had left home at 10 a. m. yesterday in response to an invitation to call on Browning and Mary. The child had not returned, according to the mother.

Two hours later, after police had even used the radio in an effort to locate the girl, the mother telephoned that she had found Sarah.

"Mr. Browning has promised to adopt me, too, in about three weeks," Sarah told her mother.

Browning said, however, he had no intention of adopting any more children.

The exact whereabouts of Dorothy Sunshine, who, according to Browning, is "up in Vermont," has become a center of interest in Coler's investigation.

Murderer Is Executed After Trying Suicide

HUNTSVILLE, Texas, Aug. 7.—Cheated in a last minute attempt to end his life, George Clem Gray, 40, former prohibition agent and deputy sheriff of Titus county, was sent to death in the electric chair here early today for the slaying of Otis Ballard in 1923.

The doomed man was dragged to the chair with blood streaming from his neck, slashed with a safety razor blade. He was pronounced dead at

12:08 o'clock, four minutes after the current was applied.
