

Major Tournaments Start With East-West Matches

DAVIS PLAYERS NOT ANNOUNCED

But Selections Decided On, Is Believed

(U. P. Special Wire to The Bend Bulletin.)
 NEW YORK, Aug. 7.—Tennis starts its grand opera season on the courts of the West Side tennis club at Forest Hills this afternoon with the opening matches of the annual meeting between the east and the west.
 Beginning with the east-west matches, the star players will be engaged almost continuously in major tournaments until next mid-September, when the men's national championship finishes the season.
 Coming just as they do this year immediately after the trials for the Davis cup team, the east-west matches will be of more than ordinary interest.
 The committee of the tennis association which is to pick the team that will defend the Davis cup, already probably has made up its mind, but no announcement is to be made until August 20.
 William Tilden, world's champion, is a cinch to be No. 1. The No. 2 honor will depend upon the result of a singles match tomorrow afternoon between Vinnie Richards and Bill Johnston, the second and third ranking American players. Dick Williams probably will be given the fourth place on the team.
 Tilden and Johnston, who defeated Richards and Williams in two out of three matches during the trials, no doubt will be assigned to play the doubles match in the challenge round for the cup.
 Today's matches will bring together Dr. George King and John Hennessey, the Indianapolis star, and Manuel Alonso, the Spanish Davis cup player, and Cranston Holman, the California collector. Richards and Williams will play against Billy Johnston and Fred Griffin, and Tilden and young George Lott will meet the Kinsey brothers of California.

Swim Across Channel Postponed for Winds

 CAPE GIRE NEZ, France, Aug. 7.—Vegetant winds and shifting currents that sweep the English channel, changeable as a woman's whims, once more have caused Gertrude Ederle, American swimmer, to postpone her off-deferred attempt to swim from France to England.
 Today Miss Ederle's trainer, Captain James Wolfe, announced that his charge will not start for another week.
 Preparations had been made for Miss Ederle to start this evening, after frequent previous postponements. Then Captain Wolfe, studying weather reports, charts, barometries, and drawing upon his own knowledge of the channel's tides, decided that conditions were not quite propitious.
 Tom Burgess, trainer of Lillian Harrison, Anglo-Argentine swimmer, who planned to start simultaneously with the American girl, said the South American champion will start "the first fine day, Monday at the latest."

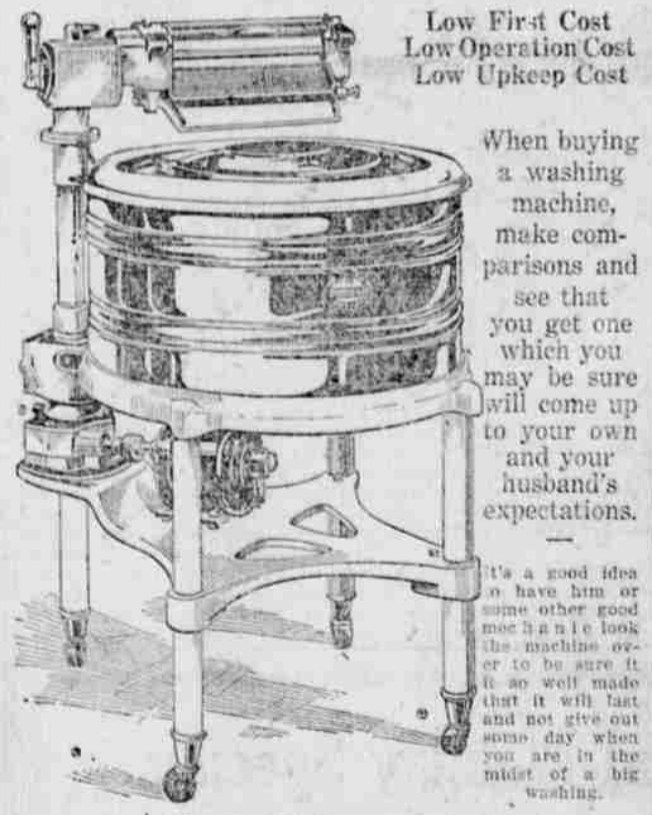
