Plan Annual Field Day At Experiment Station

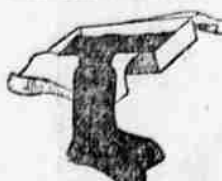

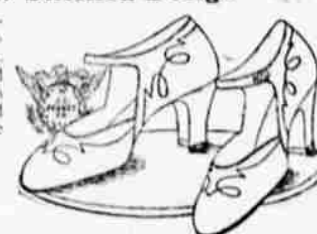

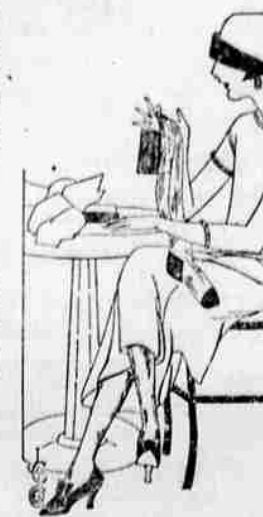
