

WOULD READOPT FOSTER CHILD

Real Mother Still Approves of "Father"

Girl Attempts Suicide When Likelihood of Being Sent to Own Home Develops

 LONG ISLAND CITY, N. L., Aug. 8.—Frances C. Dale, attorney for Edward W. Browning, said this evening that Mary Louise, the millionaire's adopted daughter, was an "adventuress" and must take the consequences of any action the district attorney may take to invalidate the adoption. He added, however, that Browning and the girl remain very fond of one another.

NEW YORK, Aug. 8.—While the harsh actualities of life tore at the fragile fabric of her dream world, New York's modern Cinderella planned to slip from the city for a quiet week end with her new foster father and a companion—hoping it might end happily after all. Mary Louise Spas, now admitted by her parents to be 21 years old, became so hysterical over the public-

ity her adoption by Edward W. Browning has brought her, that she attempted to swallow a small portion of iodine last night. No harm was done and today she was smiling once more the sunny smile that won her adoption by the millionaire over 12,000 other applicants.

Browning may lose Mary Louise because she was more than 21 when he adopted her. He can adopt her all over again, however, and said today he would do so if necessary.

"I won't give her up," the millionaire said. And Mary Louise echoed his sentiments that they were happy in their relationship of father and daughter. And Mrs. Spas, Bohemian mother of the new little rich girl, added she was sure Browning would care properly and well for her daughter.

 The district attorney of Queen's county and the commissioner of public welfare and agent of the S. P. C. C. had yet to make their reports, however. District Attorney Newcombe sent for Browning to come to his office this afternoon.

BARTON, Vt., Aug. 8.—A nine year old girl, Dorothy Sunahine Browning, who rose from the obscurity of abandonment to enjoy the home of a millionaire foster father, played happily at a summer camp here today, unaware that two efforts were under way to shatter her life of dreams.

She had not been told that a bitter controversy had developed over her new sister, Mary Louise Spas Browning, whom their mutual foster

father, Edward W. Browning, had promised her. Nor had she been informed that Mrs. William St. John of Rye, N. Y., her first foster parent, who signed her over to Browning six years ago, now wants to get her back. "Nothing will be said to Dorothy about the reports from New York," said Miss Clara Colburne, in charge of May House, the summer camp, to the United Press. Mary Louise Spas, Edward Browning's adopted "Cinderella girl," this afternoon was ordered by the district attorney of Queen's county taken from Browning's custody and given into that of an unnamed matron, who will care for her. This action followed a three hour questioning of Miss Mary here this afternoon.

BIG DIRIGIBLE MAY BE BOUGHT

Commercial Use of Los Angeles Seen

President Coolidge Known to Favor Plan For Sale of Airship

 SWAMPSCOTT, Aug. 8.—A proposal to turn the naval dirigible "Los Angeles" over to a private corporation for the operation of the first lighter than air passenger and freight aerial navigation service was made today to President Coolidge, who views the plan with favor.

John Hayes Hammond, Jr., noted inventor, representing a newly formed airways corporation organized for the promotion of commercial use of dirigibles, presented the plan in tentative form to the president and Secretary of Commerce Hoover, the administration's chief economic advisor, at a conference at the summer White House today.

The administration has favored the principle of this plan for several months but this is the first definite offer. Secretary Work, Secretary Wilbur and Secretary Hoover were immediately directed by President Coolidge to consider the proposition and the trio will probably evolve a definite contract for the use of the mammoth "Los Angeles."

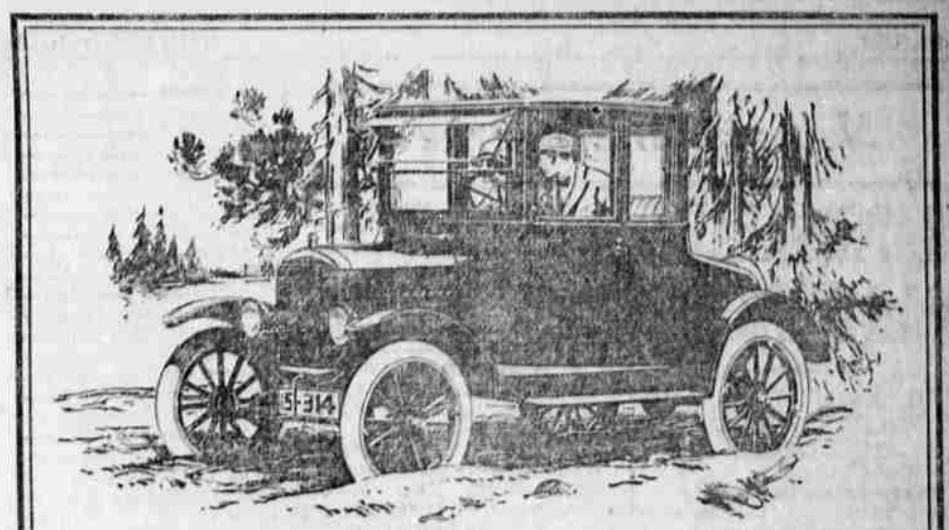
Hammond, who was accompanied by Herbert Satterlee, New York lawyer, and Fred Hardesty, Washington engineer, proposed that the dirigible be turned over to their corporation under the operation of a navy crew and officers. A clause in the agreement with Germany under which the dirigible was acquired by this country provides that the airship can be used only for non military purposes.

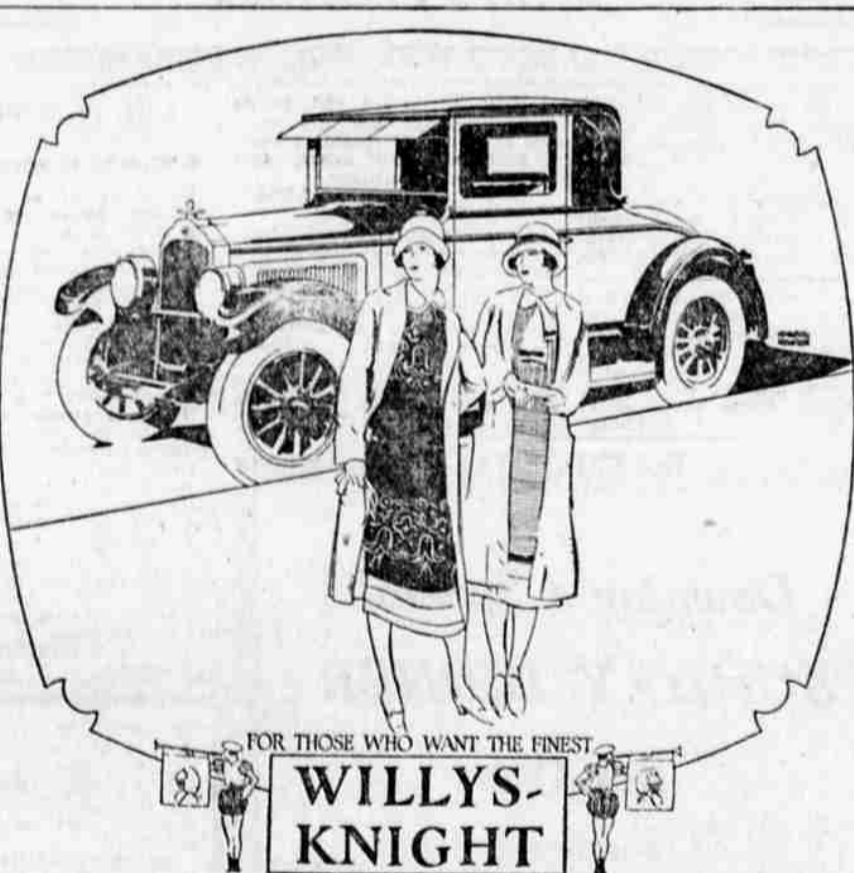
