STOCK PRICES SEEKING LEVEL

Adjustment In Trading Recognized

(Wall Street Journal Financial Review)

NEW YORK, Aug. 12.—Stocks developed greater uniformity in the up-side in the afternoon trading following a drop of call money to four per cent against the renewal rate of 4 1/2 per cent. Proceeding this development, price movements were badly mixed.

In addition to the easier tone of call money, the market was assisted in its task of absorbing large scale profit taking by the general constructive tenor of the business news. Weekly reviews of the steel trade again report moderate improvements.

The price situation has also cleared and while no important advances have been announced, the general list shows no downward revision from levels that have existed during the past several weeks. The trade is encouraged by indications that railroads will shortly enter the market for large orders of steel rails. The market closed higher. Closing prices included:

Work For Month Heavy Shows Report of A.R.C.

An analysis of the work of the Bend chapter of the American Red Cross for July as compiled this month by Mrs. V. A. Forbes shows that the past month has been an unusually busy one. A total of 150 cases, 49 ex-service men and 110 civilians, were handled in July.

The following services were rendered to ex-service men: Filled adjusted compensation claims for six; assisted 12 with disability compensation claims; visited two in hospital; rendered financial assistance to two; secured medical assistance for one; secured hospitalization for one; assisted two with child welfare cases; cooperated with the United States Veterans' Bureau in two cases; and rendered various forms of service to 10 others.

Assistance given civilians by the local chapter of the American Red Cross include the following: Served 72; employed and employed, through its employment bureau; assisted 19 in child welfare cases; furnished a nurse for one; cooperated with the women's protective division in one case; followed up loans for 11 and assisted a large number in other ways, such as friendly calls and information.

Redecoration of Inn Practically Complete

Redecoration of the Pilot Butte Inn dining room following the recent destructive fire, is practically completed and the installation of lighting fixtures and furniture will begin at once, with the probability that the dining room will be opened in about a week. Manager R. M. Wood stated today.
