HIGHER LEVELS SEEN IN TRADE

Market Continues Aggressive as Week Ends

(Wall Street Journal Financial Review)
NEW YORK, Aug. 15.—Trading reaction resulted from profit taking in some sections of the list in the week end session. But the market as a whole maintained the aggressive characteristics it has recently displayed. General Electric and Mack Truck soared to higher levels, while Westinghouse Air Brake reached new high ground for the present bull swing and vigorous buying orders were prosecuted in various recent favorites in both the industrial and railroad groups.
Speculation showed an increasing disposition to favor the rails, particularly the low priced issues like Wabash Common and Ontario and Western. Steel shares were also believed to be headed for high prices due to optimism over the Saturday's prospects.

Gas Taxes for Oregon Showing Great Advance

State taxes on gasoline and distillate sales during the month of June, 1925, amounted to \$293,897.90 as against \$176,799.05 for June, 1924, representing an increase of about 12 per cent in gasoline sales and a little more than three per cent decrease in the sale of distillate. Gasoline sales for June, 1925, aggregated 9,609,741.3 gallons, as compared to 8,607,014 for June, 1924, and the June, 1925, distillate sales amounted to 224,231.7 gallons as compared to 233,063.5 gallons for the corresponding month last year.
For the six months period, January 1, to June 30, 1925, a tax of \$1,336,599.43 was collected on the sale of 42,895,861.2 gallons of gasoline, at three cents per gallon, and 1,991,031 gallons of distillate at 2½ cents per gallon, as against a tax of \$1,175,355.29 for the same period of 1924 upon the sale of 37,821,881 gallons of gasoline and 1,666,816.4 gallons of distillate. From February 25, 1919, when the original motor fuel tax law went into effect, to July 1, 1925, an aggregate of \$9,061,705.61 has been collected and turned into the state highway fund, upon the sale of 387,692,796.55 gallons of gasoline and 21,418,290.25 gallons of distillate, less refunds and administrative costs. Of the total amount of tax collected refunds amounting to \$229,947.64 have been made upon motor fuels sold to operators of farm tractors, motor boats, commercial cleaning establishments, etc. from March 1, 1921, to June 30, 1925, inclusive, pursuant to the provisions of chapter 412, laws of 1921.
