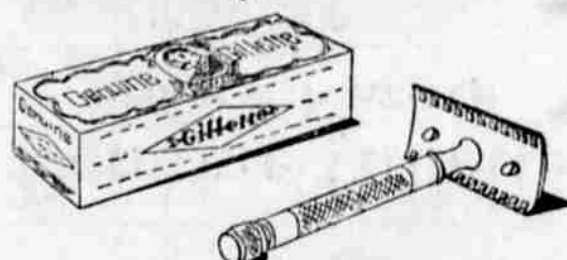

set land. This will not be inspected by the desert land board.

Settlers of the Tumalo project are exceedingly optimistic relative to the decision of the state officials when their inspection of the municipal improvement district is completed. McEllan mentioned when in Bend today. The visit of the securities commission and the desert land board has been so timed that the officials can see for themselves the productivity of the lands. ## Shooting of Husband Calls Wife From Bend

Hearing that her husband had been killed in Portland by Leroy E. Hanson, Mrs. James O'Day planned to leave for the Multnomah county city today. Instead of visiting in Bend, as was reported in press dispatches from Portland yesterday, Mrs. O'Day was working here, having been employed as a waitress in a local restaurant.

O'Day was killed in Portland by Hanson when Mrs. Hanson was seen to enter the O'Day apartment, ostensibly for the purpose of showing O'Day how to operate a flat iron. It is said, O'Day died at the St. Vincent hospital about three hours after the shooting. A charge of first degree murder has been placed against Hanson, who is a former special police officer.

Mrs. O'Day is a youthful woman. She did not appear to be greatly perturbed by the death of her husband, mentioning that he had probably been drinking again. She plans to return to Bend after attending the funeral in Portland.
