

Pittsburgh Pirates Take Double Header From Giants

BUNCHED HITS ANNEX FIRST

And Homer Takes Second of Crucial Series

POLO GROUNDS, NEW YORK, Aug. 22—Pittsburgh increased its lead in the National league pennant race to five games by taking a double header from the New York Giants today by scores of 8 to 1 and 2 to 1. Bunched hits in two big innings gave the Pirates the first game and Glenn Wright's homer with one on won the second game.

The Pirates clinched the game with a rally in the ninth inning. They blasted Barnes out of the box and scored five runs. Fritch's homer in the third inning was the only offensive blow the Giants registered off Meadows.

NEW YORK, Aug. 22—A bright, cool day—perfect baseball weather—greeted the Pittsburgh Pirates and the New York Giants today and both teams were set to jump into the double header that opened the most important five-game series of the year.

The players realized better than the fans that their pennant chances might be blown by a bad showing in the series. The Pirates were under a heavier mental burden than the Giants because they had a three-game lead to protect against the gamiest fighting club in the big leagues.

Otherwise the Pittsburgh club is better equipped than the Giants. They hit the ball harder and run the bases much faster than the Giants and the pitching staff is better balanced than McGraw's.

The day of rest also will be of benefit to the Pirates in that it should have brought Carey, the star center fielder, and Eddie Moore, the hard hitting second baseman, one day closer to active duty.

Carey, who comes close to being the mainspring of the offense, has been out of the game with a bad ankle, and Moore went stale.

Bill McKechnie, manager of the Pirates, said he doubted that they would be able to play today and he hinted that Higbee would hold down Carey's job and Johnny Rawlings would play second base.
