News of the Markets

MARKET GETS SOUND BASIS

Railroad Stocks Show Rising Tendency

(Wall Street Journal Financial Review) NEW YORK, Aug. 22.—Trading settled down to a sounder basis in the week end session. Greater consideration was given to underlying conditions and the speculation developed an increasing disposition to favor issues whose possibilities had not been discounted.

Rails were found to have the greatest number of eligible issues in this class and vigorous bullish demonstrations occurred in various carrier shares.

Activity at rising prices took place in Chesapeake and Ohio, St. Louis Southwestern, Frisco, Texas and Pacific, Rock Island, Wabash and M. K. & T. Although the recent feverishness was no longer observable among the industrial leaders, stocks of this kind continued to display unimpaired vigor.

Steel common reached new high ground for the present forward movement, while American Can maintained the high levers of its history and considerable underlying buying power was suggested by the action of General Electric, General Motors and other pivotal issues.
