## STEEL LEADER ON EXCHANGE

### Strength Shown by General List

(Wall Street Journal Financial Review)  
NEW YORK, Aug. 26.—United States Steel was the leader of another vigorous forward movement in the general list today. Under cover of its strength, considerable distribution appeared to be in progress in other recent industrial favorites like American Can, General Motors, White and American Smelting.

Marland, the Pan American and other active oils were also heavily sold. Southern Railway, Seaboard and Wabash attained the high levels of their market careers.

Explanation of the general character of the advance in the railroad group was furnished by July earnings statements which showed the improvement in earnings was widespread geographically.

## SECURITY PACT PARLEY ASKED

### German Representative Invited to London

### Versailles Treaty Can't be Supplanted, Stressed in Reply by French

PARIS, Aug. 26.—Germany has been invited to start oral negotiations toward cleaning up unsettled questions in the proposed allied-German security pact.

When France's answer to Germany's last security note was handed to Foreign Minister Stresemann in Berlin, French Ambassador De Margerie invited the German government to send a legal adviser to London to confer with similar representatives of Britain, France and Belgium.

They would then report to their foreign ministers as a preliminary to a conference of foreign ministers at Geneva in September.

The idea of American trusteeship in connection with the pact as originally broached, has been abandoned due to unfavorable reception of the suggestion in Washington.

Through the proposed London conference, it is hoped that the security pact will be well on its way toward final acceptance. The allies have hitherto expressed a desire that Germany should apply for entrance to the league of nations in the September plenary session.

The reply itself also invites the Germans to enter security negotiations which the allies "earnestly hope will result in the conclusion of

a definite treaty."

France's answer to the last German note concerning the proposed allied-German security pact, reiterates France's previous position that the pact cannot supersede the Versailles treaty.

The answer, made public tonight, warns Germany that she cannot expect to upset the Versailles treaty by the security pact.

The note also repeats France's previous insistence upon German entrance into the league of nations without special conditions, as a preliminary to conclusion of the pact.

Despite these insistences, the tone of the note is conciliatory.

It declares that the proposed arbitration treaties connected with the pact must provide that the arbitration of disputes shall be obligatory.

## Officials of S. P. & S. Obtain Evidence Here

Here for the purpose of securing data which will be presented before the interstate commerce commission hearing in Portland on October 5, Charles Hart, attorney for the S. P. & S., and R. W. Pickard, general freight agent for the same line, are in Bend today.

The task of amassing evidence in support of the contention of the Northern lines that the proposed extension south from Bend is justified is progressing favorably, the rail officials report. The support of Bend at the hearing is counted on, it has been made known.

Pickard and Hart arrived here from the interior, where they spent several days gathering evidence.

## JUMPS FAR TO DEATH

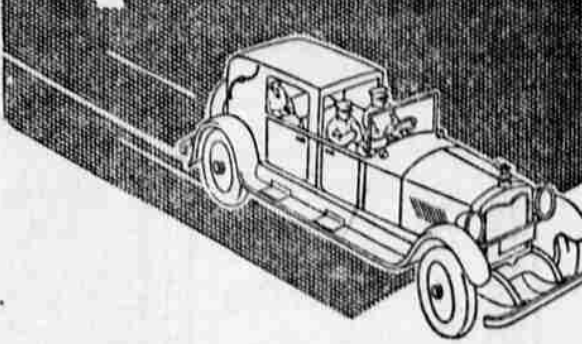
