

# WILL CELEBRATE HIGHWAY ENDING

## Demonstration in Wasco to be on Tenth

### Work on Northern Part of The Dalles-California Fin- ished Ahead of Time

Completion of The Dalles-California highway in Wasco county will be celebrated on September 10, according to tentative plans being laid in The Dalles. The last truck load of crushed rock was placed on the highway near Maupin last Saturday afternoon.

The highway is now complete from its junction with the paved Columbia river highway near The Dalles, to Bend with the exception of Trail crossing, where the highest vehicular bridge in the world is being constructed by Kuckenbach & Wittman.

Completion of the highway in Wasco county was made 45 days ahead of schedule, the contracts calling for ending the work September 20. Contractors Joslin & Allister, the last to work on the highway in that county, have broken camp and moved.

If the celebration is held September 10, both the old and the new state highway commissions will be invited. A caravan will be organized to take the commissioners and ex-commissioners over the highway from The Dalles to Maupin.

Residents of Maupin have agreed to banquet the members of the official party there. In return to The Dalles there would be another banquet at the Hotel Dalles.

The Dalles-California highway construction in Wasco county was actually started less than three years ago when the first link, between The Dalles and Dufur was graded. At the same time the state highway commission awarded a contract for the grading of the Cow canyon section at the extreme southern end of the county.

Three followed at successive intervals, the awarding of other contracts for the grading and surfacing of units between Dufur and Maupin, the last being from White river to six miles beyond Maupin.
