

# BIG PLANES FLY TO START TRIP

Takeoff Set for Monday Afternoon

Full Load Tests to be Made Tomorrow for Journey to Hawaii

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 29.—One step nearer their giant hop across the sea to Hawaii, two of the navy's trio of seaplanes selected for the trip will fly today from the Crissy field water front to the position in San Pablo bay from which the start will be made.

Flight officials said the PB-1 would take off Sunday for San Pablo. It was not certain when it would be in shape for trials.

The PB-2 planes were pronounced today in shape for their flights preliminary actual taking off. The condition of the PB-1, the giant Boeing plane, was unknown, however, and, but in unofficial quarters it was suggested that the new craft might not be in shape and possibly could not be gotten in condition for the scheduled hop to Hawaii Monday at 2 p. m.

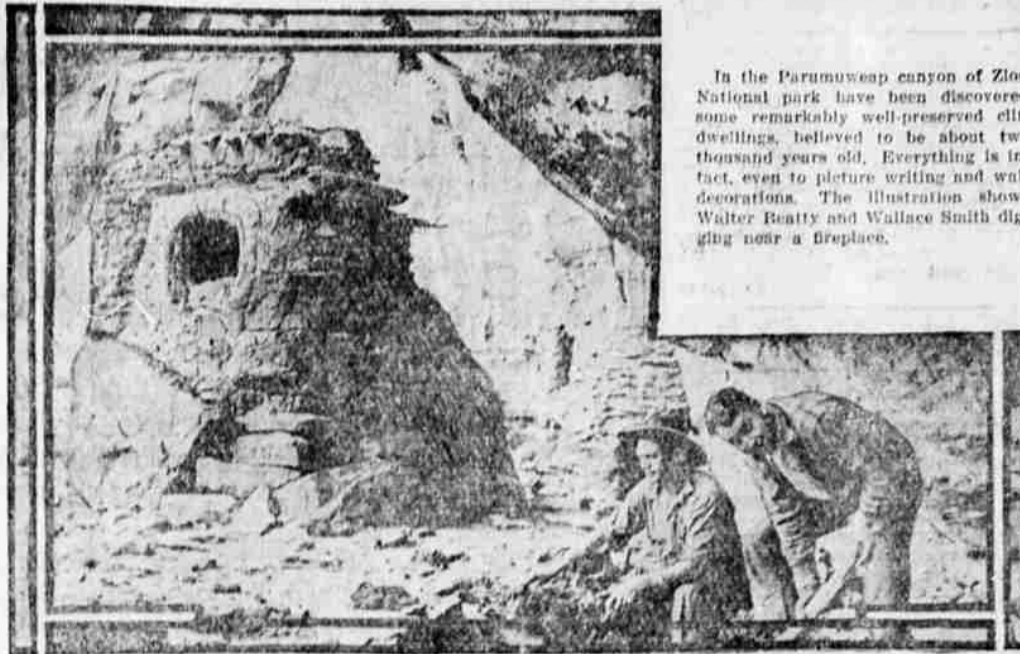
Whether this would mean another delay in the start or that only the PB-2 hydroplanes would make the trans Pacific flight could not be ascertained.

Near Admiral William A. Moffatt, chief of the bureau of navy aeronautics, will arrive from San Diego tomorrow and any uncertain points will be cleared up after he confers with Captain Stamford Moses, flight project commander.

Captain Moses has announced full load test flights of the PB-2 planes tomorrow from the San Pablo bay base.

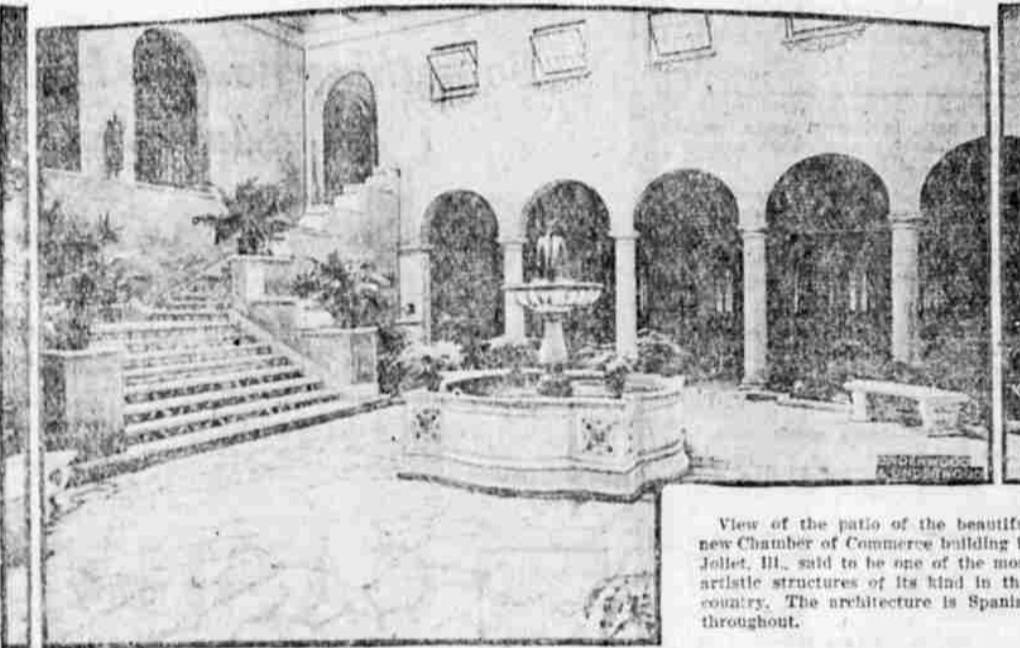
The Hawaiian flight will start, according to his announcement, from Midshipmen's point, on the northern shore of San Pablo bay. The ships will taxi for a mile or more straight down the bay before taking the air, fly to a point opposite the Golden Gate and then head through the gate for the ocean.

## SUMMER TOURISTS GIVEN NEW ROUTE

Speed Limit Raised on Trip into Canada

Summer tourists have been given a new and fast motor route into the Canadian wilderness in and near Winnipeg by a "dawn till dusk" run at 41 miles an hour from Winnipeg to Minneapolis, sponsored by Dominion and Minnesota officials and the Winnipeg Tribune.

Mayor Ralph Webb of Winnipeg personally brought Canada's welcome to all America, riding in the official leading car which set the new day-

light time record.

The 494 mile ribbon of excellent highway, flowing over fertile plains to the Canadian province from Minneapolis, now covered in a few minutes less than 12 hours, was that known as the Red River trail in the old days when prairie schooners required a little less than a month to reach the portals of old Fort Tarry.

Aside from the neighborly relations promoted by the trip between the northern province and Minnesota's cities, the feat brings to pointed attention the splendid opportunity this route provides for Americans to use in entering the open places, the lakes and woods of Canada for summer touring, where scenery, inspiring climate and excellent fishing await the

traveler.

The route, running south from Winnipeg, runs through Morris, Emerson, Hallock, Warren, Crookston, Erskine, Mahanomen, Detroit, Wadena, Long Prairie, Little Falls, St. Cloud and Minneapolis.

Mayors of all these cities lifted the speed limits for the caravan and provided escorts of motorcycle police and fire equipment to help establish the 12 hour record.

G. L. Maitland pulled his Studebaker six away from the Winnipeg city hall at 4:55 o'clock in the morning. In the official car with him were Mayor Webb, Roy Parkhill, a world war aviator, as relief driver; A. W. Curdy of the Winnipeg Tribune, and H. W. Sewell, a Minnesota highway superintendent.

Out of the 12 cars starting, the Studebaker and two others kept the schedule. Another got in at 9 o'clock. Three others made it by midnight. One turned over and burned.

## Bandit Raiders Strike Three Towns in Canada
