

America's Big Four To Fight For National Tennis Title

ALL FOREIGNERS ARE ELIMINATED

Johnson, Richards, Tilden, Williams Left

WEST SIDE TENNIS CLUB, Forest Hills, N. Y., Sept. 17.—Surviving a formidable foreign invasion, America's "big four" will fight it out for the national tennis championship.
Bill Johnston, Vinnie Richards, Dick Williams and Bill Tilden, the team which successfully defended the Davis cup last week, survived the fourth round of the national tournament here today and will meet tomorrow in the semi final round.
The two surviving foreigners were eliminated when Bill Johnston beat Manuel Alonso at 6-3, 6-5, 6-1 and 6-2, and Vinnie Richards defeated Rene Lacoste, the Wimbledon champion, at 6-2, 6-3 and 6-5.
Dick Williams defeated Howard Kinsey at 7-5, 6-4, 6-3, and Bill Tilden downed his fellow Philadelphian, Wallace Johnson, at 6-4, 6-0 and 6-4.
Johnston will meet Williams tomorrow and Tilden will play Richards.

WEST SIDE TENNIS CLUB, Forest Hills, N. Y., Sept. 17.—Playing serious and aggressive tennis for the first time in the national championship tournament, William T. Tilden II, defending champion, became a semi finalist today when he defeated Wallace Johnson, veteran Philadelphia star, 6-4, 6-0, 6-4.

Tilden looked the champion in every stroke when he was trying, but he could not get away from his habitual trifling at times. The only time Johnson made a showing was when Tilden used a chop stroke against him.

In the second set, Tilden played spectacular tennis and won at love. He smashed from the base line and charged to the net, having Johnson baffled completely.

R. N. Williams entered the semi finals in the upper half when he defeated Howard Kinsey 7-5, 6-4, 6-3. Williams was not as brilliant or as spectacular as he was in his victory over Jean Borotra yesterday, but he was plenty good enough to beat the young Californian.
