

LIBRARY SUPPLIES
BOOKS FOR SCHOOLS

Most of Branches Open Only Through Winter

Work of supplying each school in Deschutes county with books from the Deschutes county library is now under way, according to Miss Helen Johns, librarian. Redmond, states Miss Johns, has a permanent collection of volumes in its public library, partly owned by the library in that town and partly supplied from the Deschutes county library.

In Terrebonne there are two collections of books. Those for children are kept in the school house during the winter. Sisters, Millican, the diatomite plant and some of the lumber camps also have year round stations. The others are open only during the winter months when people have "time to read."

So far this month, 313 books have been sent to nine stations, Miss Johns reports. The central library in Bend will send books to about 40 stations the first six weeks, dating from the opening of the schools. Each collection of books will be changed about once every two months.

Principal Calls Drill
While Siren Sounding

With realism added by the blowing of the city fire siren, the Bend high school held a fire drill shortly after 1 o'clock this afternoon. The siren was blowing for a fire elsewhere in the city, but Principal D. A. Emerson took advantage of that fact and rang the fire gong which calls for the emptying of the high school.

Although they have just entered a new building, the students filed out in perfect order without any confusion. The doors at each of the five exits from the first floor and those which lead onto the fire escapes from the second floor are all equipped with "panic bolts"—bars which open the doors automatically if a crowd is thrust against them.

Detour at City Approach
Advised to Avoid Grading

Persons driving from Bend to the south approach of The Dalles-California highway are advised to detour by way of Franklin avenue and Third street, in order to avoid the construction work now in progress on the section of Scott street which is outside the city limits. Grading in preparation for paving is now under way.

Paving of this section is to be financed through cooperation of the Brooks-Scanlon Lumber Co., the Bend Iron Works, the Union Oil Co., Anton Aune, the Oregon Trunk railway and the county.

COUNTY COURT
PROCEEDINGS

Bend, Oregon, September 11, 1925. The county court of Deschutes county met this day, pursuant to adjournment, all members being present, whereupon the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

In the matter of the Northwest Redmond market road. This matter came on to be heard upon the second reading of the viewers' report, and said report was read for the second time, as provided by law.

There being no further business to come before the court, adjournment was then had until Saturday, September 12, 1925.

Bend, Oregon, September 12, 1925. The county court of Deschutes county met this day, pursuant to adjournment, all members being present, whereupon the following proceedings were had, to-wit:

In the matter of the establishment of the Northwest Redmond market road. Now on this 12th day of September, 1925, the court met to consider the viewers' report in connection with the establishment of the Northwest Redmond market road, the said viewers' report having been publicly read for the second time in this court on the 11th day of September, 1925, and the court having before it the approving opinion of the district attorney on the proceedings heretofore taken, and the court having found that the viewers' report is just and equitable and should be adopted, now, therefore, it is hereby

Ordered and adjudged that the viewers' report filed in connection with the establishment of the said road be and the same is hereby adopted as filed; and it is hereby further

Ordered that the clerk of this court issue warrants on the market road fund to the persons and in the

amounts designated in said viewers' report; and it is hereby further Ordered that said road be established and finally surveyed and opened as a public highway 60 feet in width, according to the plans now on file, and that the county surveyor be directed to monument said road and file his field notes and plat thereon in the office of the county clerk, as provided by law.

In the matter of the market road running north from Redmond. It was then reported to the court that the market road running north from Redmond was in need of improvement, and that the residents of the vicinity were willing to contribute their time and labor for the aid of such work, whereupon it was Ordered that the county contribute the sum of \$50 toward the work that is required, on condition that an equal amount be contributed by the people along the way, said work to be done under the direction of the county road master.

There being no further business to come before the court, adjournment was then had until Wednesday, September 16, 1925, at 2 o'clock p. m.

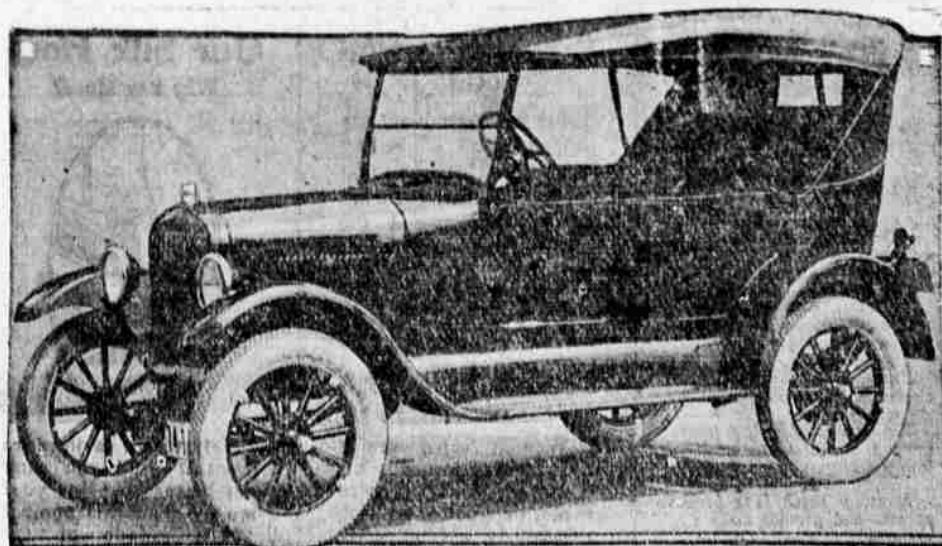

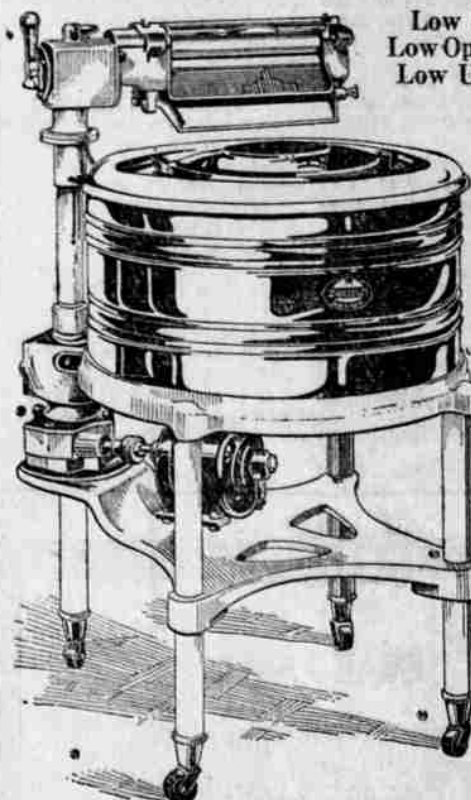
