

SNOW MANTLE TOPS MOUNTAIN HEIGHTS

Three Inch Fall Reported South of Crescent

Winter visited scattered parts of Central Oregon last night and this morning, leaving a mantle of snow on the higher ground.

Three inches of snow fell in the country southwest of Crescent lake, it is reported by members of the Windigo pass forest service road crew.

Snow covered the lakeview hills early this morning, and a coat of white mantled the earth at Crescent, according to reports reaching Bend.

Indicating that the winter storm also reached well to the north, forest service employees this morning reported that Bald Peter, a dominant peak north of Black Butte, was covered with snow.

The summit of the Cascades has been covered by clouds all day. It is predicted that a considerable amount of new snow fell in the Three Sisters and adjacent mountains last night.

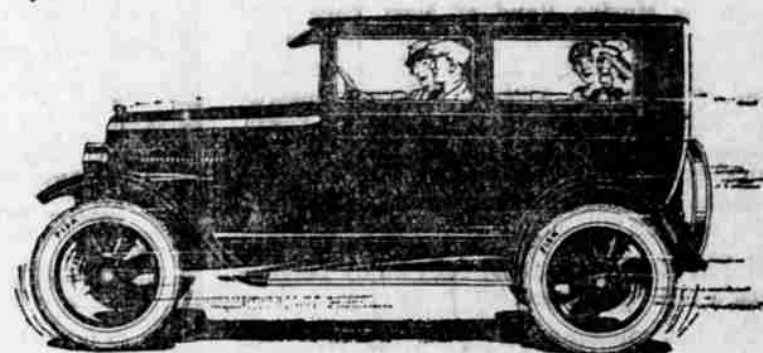
