SURVEY OF BANK NOW UNDER WAY

Assets, Liabilities Recently Printed

Survey of values represented by assets of the First National bank was progressing today, while outside the four walls of

the institution only a minimum reaction was noticeable from the action taken by the directors in closing Thursday to allow for the audit.

Last public statement of the condition of the bank, in response to call from the comptroller of the currency was made as of the close of business March 23, and was published in The Bulletin on April 14. It shows loans totaling \$998,663.30, government securities owned amounting to \$462,550, other stocks, bonds and securities of \$124,278.10, banking house and fixtures valued at \$65,978.64, reserve with the Federal Reserve bank of \$19,457.85, cash in the vault and due from national banks \$78,654.95, amount due from state banks, bankers and trust companies \$5,566.21, checks on the other local bank \$7,616.95, miscellaneous cash items of \$1,282.68, redemption fund due from U. S. treasurer of \$825, and other assets of \$8,871.75.

CITY OF ANCIENTS OBSERVES HOLIDAY

Herculaneum Is to Give Back Treasures

Rome, April 21.—(AP)—Probably the world's oldest holiday, that recalling the birthday of Rome, or founding of the city by Romulus and Remus in 753, B. C., was celebrated with great pomp and splendor throughout Italy today.

The occasion, since fascism's coming into power, supplants the red "labor day" of May 1.

By 9 o'clock, blackshirt legions and groups were massed in every town and village of the land. The Italian tri-color flew from every municipality, side by side with the city flag in those centers which boast a civic emblem.

Rome was ablaze with color; the red, white and green of the national flag hanging from almost every house in the city. In the Corso, Rome's Broadway, there was hardly a window which did not fly the tri-color.

An endless procession of Rome's workmen, including a representation from the provinces, defiled through the principal streets. These were the fascist syndicates. The black shirt was worn by practically everyone in the procession.

Today's "birthday of Rome" was chiefly an archeological fete, for four important undertakings were either inaugurated or opened to the public.

Aurora, Ill., April 21.—(AP)—America's richest summer racing season opens here today. Two days more and Lexington will open its 101st year, and in four days the metropolitan season will open in New York.

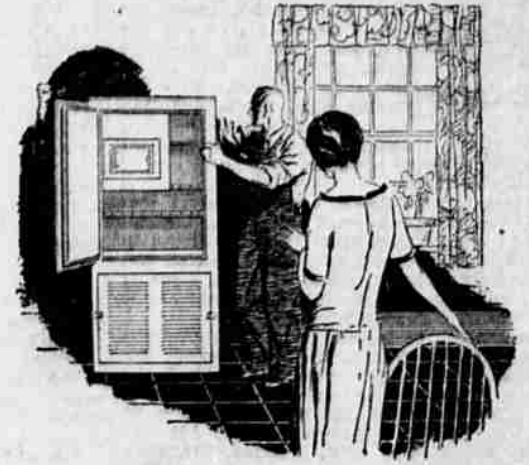
