

# Game Here Sunday Will Be Contest Between Hard Hitting Nines

## PENDLETON DANGEROUS

### Buckaroos' Clubs Are Very Potent

Sunday's game between the Bend Elks and the Pendleton Buckaroos seems slated to be a contest of hitting power, according to batting and fielding averages compiled for both clubs. The Elks boast eight hitters above the .300 mark, two of them .400 or better, while the Buckaroos have three men above the .400 mark and two more better than .300.

Curly Fuller, left-hander who is scheduled to carry the burden of mound duty for the Elks Sunday, is leading the local team in batting with an average of .438 for the six games in which he has taken part. Next in line comes Al Brentano, hard hitting outfielder with an even .400 and close behind him is Harry Ellinger, acting captain and catcher who was leading the squad up to the close of the Mid-Columbia season. Ellinger has an average of .385 for 11 games.

**Stokoe Well Up**  
Clyde Stokoe comes fourth with .346 for 15 games, and Pete Allen fifth with .343 for 17 games, while Kennedy, Brown and Roberts each got one hit for every three times at bat for an average performance of .333.

In the Buckaroo lineup, Quinn, center fielder, is high man with .422. Hoskins, catcher, and King, second baseman, are close to a tie with .405 and .404 respectively. There is a big drop in the next two places, Cook, third baseman, having .327 and Hattrop, the only pitcher listed on the squad, .320.

In preparation for tomorrow's game, the Elks tried out a new infield combination last night against the Bend Hardware team. Ralph Russell, pitcher on the Goldendale squad during the Mid-Columbia season, was holding down first base during the first few innings, with Peterson on second, Art Parker at short and Wood on third. Later in the game, Pete Allen, who was moved out to center field early in the Mid-Columbia season, came back to his old position at first base and Russell went out into the garden. Pete seemed to feel at home in the keystone position and it is possible that he will be started there Sunday.

**Russell on Deck**  
Russell will be available as a relief pitcher Sunday. It was indicated by Harold Kline, chairman of the Elks baseball committee, who has been worrying over the problem of filling the post left temporarily vacant by Fred Roberts' injury. Roberts is reported to have hopes of being back on the job by the end of the month, since his injured hand is healing rapidly. For the past few practice sessions he has been chucking the ball around more or less cautiously in an effort to keep his throwing arm in condition while guarding the injured left.

Fuller was held in reserve last night, nursing his left arm which has been giving him trouble during the past two weeks. He reports it in much better shape, so the Buckaroo batsmen may find it hard to keep up their terrific hitting pace. Roy Slate, who usually plays on third base, undertook the pitching job yesterday but was jerked after four innings because he persisted in whiffing the hardware men. Slate protested he "hadn't thrown any yet," but since he had blanked the Bend Hardware boys for two successive innings he was pushed out to second base and C. Whetzel, Deschutes Power & Light hurler, took up the task. When Slate retired the score was 8 to 5 in favor of the Elks. Whetzel held the Twilight League to one more run, while the Elks made two more off L. Brentano.

**Douglas Is Good**  
The feature of the practice game, from the standpoint of the customers in the bleachers, was the excellent pitching of Douglas, moundman for the hardware team, who held the Elks to four hits in four innings. Douglas

### City Championship Is to be Decided

The Twilight league championship, which rests between the Bend Hardware Co. team, winners in the second half of the season, and the Deschutes Power and Light company team, winners in the opening round, will be decided tomorrow afternoon in a nine inning game on O'Donnell field. A silver cup, on display in the window of the hardware store, will be awarded the winner by L. R. Sheeley, president of the league.

Tomorrow's game comes as the climax of a four months playing schedule, divided into two sections of 28 games each. Eight teams were entered in the league, each team playing one game a week. During the first half of the season five inning games were played, with seven inning games in the second half.

Deschutes Power and Light company got away to a flying start in the opening round, winning with a perfect standing. In the second round, after a complete reorganization of the eight squads, the Bend Hardware took the lead and came through without losing a game.

Each squad is limited to 15 players, whose names were filed with league officials at the opening of the season. Bend Hardware's roster includes Ned Douglas, Ray Logan, Fred Loomis, Dick O'Brien, Courtney Allen, Don O'Leary, Johnny Logan, Paul Hampson, C. H. Houck, N. Ferguson, C. ### Food Is Still Refused By Condemned Men

Boston, July 21.—(AP)—The fifth day of their hunger strike today found Nicola Sacco and Bartolomeo Van Zetti still refusing nourishment in any form.

When guards removed the breakfast trays from the condemned men's widely separated cells at Charlestown state prison, neither had touched a morsel.

Only water has passed Sacco's lips since the beginning of the joint fast early last Sunday and Van Zetti has abstained from all nourishment except coffee and tea, which he took in small quantities during the first part of the hunger strike.

Warden William Hendry's office reported no change in the physical condition of the two men, who were in comparatively good health.

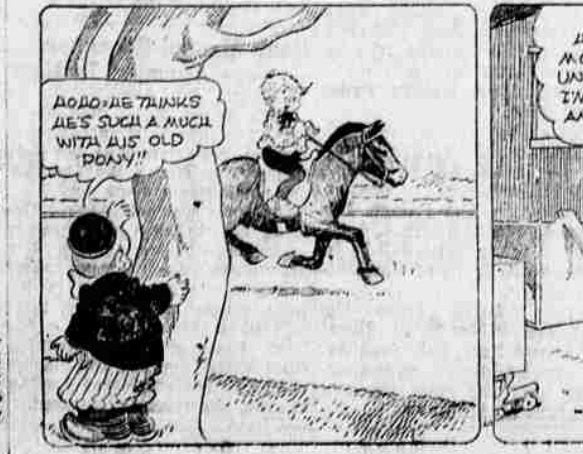

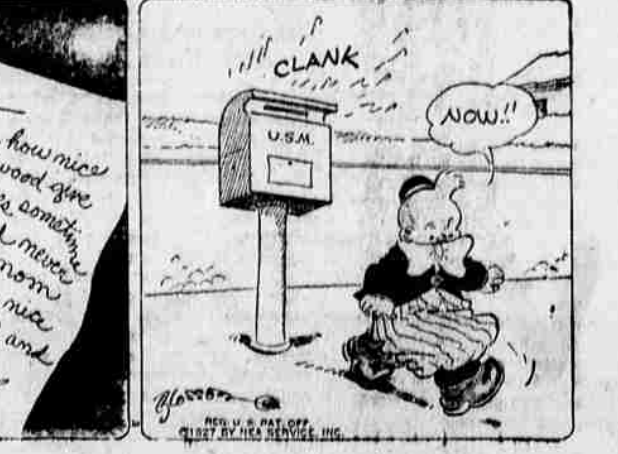
Coleman took an early lead of two holes but Dolf came back at the 7th and caught up one hole. Dolf went the first nine in 36, one over par.
