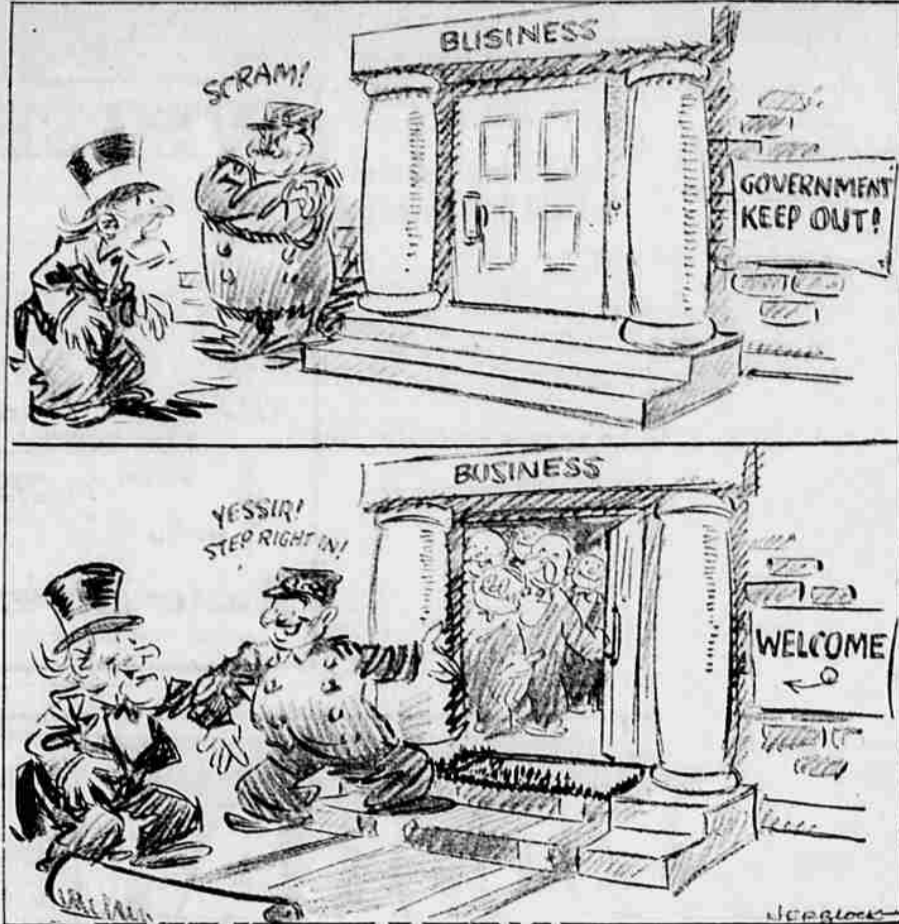

Farewell Bend and Its People

Capital Gossip

Salem, Ore. (AP)—Not many persons will qualify for old age pensions under act of the recent legislature. Those who do, will have to wait until the first of next year. The pension will be applicable to persons 70 years, who have lived in Oregon at least 15 years, and in the county where application is made at least two years. Other restrictions: Applicant must have led a proper life for the past 15 years; must not have a child or other legally bound persons able to support him; property possessed must not exceed \$4,000 in value; and upon death of the pension person, the estate, if any, may be assessed for amount of the pension paid. Amount of pension must not exceed \$30 a month to each person, and the counties are left to find the money to pay them.
