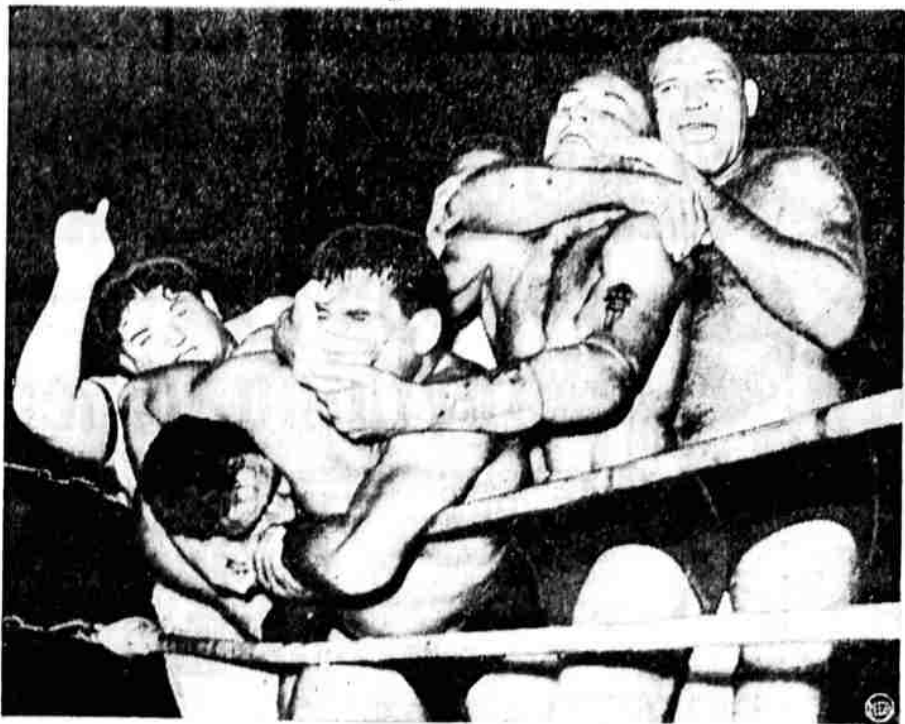

Sacramento, Cal., July 21 (AP)—District Highway Patrol Inspector Paul Maxim of Lassen county reported from Chester today he is permitting an automobile caravan of 700 Committee for Industrial Organization "refugees" from Westwood to return to the little lumber town in units of two and three cars at a time.

The augmented caravan, said by Maxim to number more than 60 cars, is comprised of 300 C. I. O. Lumber and Sawmill Workers and their families driven last week from Westwood in a C. I. O. "purge."
