

STOCKS RISE AFTER SLUMP

Late Rally Results in Net Gains

Volume Remains Small as Business News Improves

MARKETS AT A GLANCE
(By United Press)

Stocks irregular and quiet. Bonds irregular; U. S. governments higher. Curb stocks irregular. Foreign exchange easy. Cotton up as much as 75 cents a bale. Wheat off 1 to 1 1/2c; corn off 1/2 to 3/4c. Rubber steady.

New York, June 21 (AP)—The stock market rallied in late trading today after an irregular decline. A majority of issues registered gains ranging from more than a point. Volume continued small.

New highs were made by Commonwealth Edison and Engineers Public Service 5 per cent preferred. Public Service of New Jersey was up a point and Detroit Edison nearly 2 points.

Steel shares, down more than a point in early trading, recovered part of the losses. Automobile stocks displayed firmness. Rails and coppers were steady. Mercantile issues improved.

American Can gained 2 points on a few sales and Continental Can was up more than a point. Dow Chemical was up 2 points. Gains of a point or more were noted in Celanese, Hoes Sound, Libbey-Owens-Ford Glass and J. C. Penney.

Loft featured in activity and rose 1/2 point. United Air Lines was active and moderate volume came into General Motors, U. S. Rubber and Chrysler.

St. Joseph lead lost more than a point and smaller declines were noted in Douglas Aircraft, Boeing Airplane, American Smelting, Union Carbide, Phillips Petroleum and Pennsylvania Railroad. Inland Steel lost 1 1/2.

The market ran into moderate profit-taking on the rally and some leaders receded from the tops. Bonds were firm. Cotton strengthened after an early decline. Wheat lost fractions to a cent a bushel.

Business news continued favorable. Electricity output for the week ended last Saturday, reported today, was the best for any week since February 11 and the year to year gain was the best since June 12, 1937.

An upturn was noted in railroad loadings. Iron Age said the most significant development in steel industry was the determination of some branches of the trade to adopt a firmer position on prices.

Stock sales approximated 470,000 shares against 482,000 yesterday. Curb stock sales were 77,000 shares against 81,000 in the previous session.

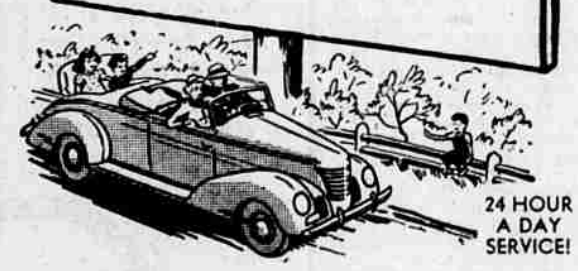
