

MARKETS SAG ON WARFEARS

Stocks and Bonds Are Hard Hit Today

Wheat and Sugar Strong; Business News In U. S. Is Good

New York, Aug. 21 (U.P.)—World markets dropped sharply today on fears over the European political situation.

New York stocks dropped 1 to 5 points to new lows since July 3 in the most active trading since August 3. Bonds were hard hit and the foreign list had losses ranging to 5 points in Italian issues. United States government bonds were weak. London prices dropped and other foreign markets were weak.

Commodities were mixed. The so-called war commodities—wheat and sugar—were strong. Cotton was slightly easier. Silk futures lost as much as 5 cents a pound and rubber futures were off a few points. Copper futures were steady.

Aside from foreign developments, news was favorable. Steel operations gained slightly to a new high for the year. Cigarette production increased. Several favorable corporation reports were issued.

Heavy offerings in steel shares sent that group down as much as 3 1/2 points in Bethlehem among common stocks and 5 1/4 points in Crucible preferred. U. S. Steel touched 43 1/2 off 2 1/2.

Chrysler sold at 75 1/4 off 3 1/4. Reports continued favorable on reception of new automobile models and it was expected motor car production would rise substantially this week after a long series of declines.

New lows were made by Boeing Airplane at 17 1/4 off 1 1/4; Harbison Walker preferred 12 1/2 off 1 1/4; Philip Morris 8 1/4 off 2 1/4; United Aircraft 3 1/4 off 2 1/4, and Santa Fe 23 1/4 off 1 1/4.

General Cable preferred lost 5 1/2 points and declines of 2 to more than 3 points were made by American Can, American Smelting, J. I. Case, Du Pont, Union Pacific and Westinghouse Electric.

Trading was dull just before the close. Some short covering steadied the list on the theory it was ready for a technical recovery after five consecutive days of decline.

Stock sales approximated 875,000 shares compared with 840,000 shares Friday. Curb stock sales were 138,000 shares against 126,000 Friday.

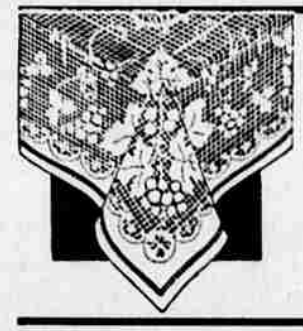
