New York, Nov. 21 (UP)—Stocks
turned lower in the last hour of trading
today after narrow, irregular
fluctuations in earlier trading.

Volume picked up slightly in late
dealings, but was light for the full
session.

Losses in the main list extended
from fractions to more than a point.
Some were down more. Norfolk &
Western, which made a new high
yesterday, lost 2 points. Certain-teed
preferred was down 2.

Declines of a point or more were
noted in Bethlehem Steel, U. S. Steel,
American Can, American Smelting,
Timken Roller Bearing, Westing-
house Electric and J. I. Case.

Federal Light and Traction pre-
ferred made a new high at 9 1/2, up
1 1/2. Federal Mining and Smelting
jumped 3 points to equal its high at
10 1/2. United Air Lines and Waldorf
system equalled their highs for the
year.

International Business Machines
jumped 2 1/2 points when directors
declared a cash dividend of \$1.50 a
share and a stock dividend of 5 per
cent. Kennecott failed to respond to
a higher dividend declaration.
Chrysler touched 88 1/2, up 1/2, and
