

Bend Team Turns In Uniforms; 7 Wins In 10 Games For Season

Hoop Practice Starts Monday First Basketball Game Is With Ashland

Marking the official end of the 1939 football season, during which Bend won seven out of ten games played against teams which included some of the strongest in the entire state, the Lava Bears turned in their football outfits today as Coach Eldon Cone prepared to issue a general call for basketball practice next week.

Bend's first basketball game of the season will be against Ashland, on the Bend court, December 15, followed by a second game against the same school the following night. On December 22 and 23 Bend will play in Lakeview, as the Bears complete their pre-holiday schedule.

A review of the 1939 football season shows that two of the three defeats suffered by the Bears this fall were inflicted by teams that finished their regular season undefeated. These teams were Medford, possible state champions of 1939, and Klamath Falls, only team that earned even a tie against Medford.

- Bend's outstanding victories of 1939 were over Salem, 13 to 7, Pendleton, 13 to 6, The Dalles, 13 to 7, and Oregon City, 19 to 7.
