## Few Changes Made in Dull Market

New York, June 21 (AP)—Trading on the stock market today fell off to the lightest levels of the year as market operators awaited German terms for the French surrender. Prices generally fluctuated irregularly, with changes small.

Business news reflected activity in preparation for a swing into the nation's defense program.

Indications that elimination of French orders was having less adverse influence on the steel industry than had been expected sustained steel shares. A smaller than seasonal decline in automobile output aided motors. Chrysler and General Motors had small gains. Electric Auto-Lite rose a point. Rubber shares were fractionally higher.

Aircraft were up fractions to a point. Coppers were steady despite uncertainty over large French orders. American Smelting and Anaconda lost slightly. Kennecott made a small advance. International Nickel lost a point.

U. S. Rubber preferred at its high of 80 was up 2 1/2. Allied Chemical and Brooklyn Manhattan Transit were up 2 points.

## Commission to Conduct Exams for Varied Jobs

A second series of tests to set up new two-year merit registers for positions in the state unemployment commission today by Professor William Griffith, supervisor for the board of examiners.

Four general classifications ranging in pay from \$900 to \$3,000 a year are included in the series, applications for which must be received not later than July 15 by the board at the Portland office, 701 Spaulding building.

Any Oregon resident having the required experience and other qualifications may take the examinations, which are to be held, probably in August, in Portland, Salem, LaGrande, Klamath Falls and Roseburg.

Examinations to be given, along with salary ranges, follow: Clerk-typist \$900 to \$1,200; clerk-stenographer \$950 to \$1,500; key punch operator \$1,020 to \$1,300; tabulating machine operator \$1,440 to \$2,280; tabulating supervisor \$2,280 to \$2,760; informational representative \$2,100 to \$2,580; appeals referee \$2,400 to \$3,000.
