STOCKS MAKE STRONG GAINS

Steels and Motors Are Featured

Some Issues Rise Nearly Three Points With Volume Better

MARKETS AT A GLANCE

Stocks strong and moderately active. Bonds higher; U. S. government issues higher. Foreign stocks higher. Corn unchanged in New York at 34 1/2c.

New York, Aug. 21 (AP)—Stocks advanced today for the fourth successive session in the most active trading in a week. Gains ranged to 3 points. Steels and motors featured. Favorable news attracted some buyers and caused holders of stocks to demand higher prices. Indications of higher car loadings steadied rails. The government awarded a

\$15,000,000 contract to Savage Arms and the stock spurted more than 3 points. Chrysler, which has several government contracts, also gained more than 3 points. Bethlehem at its high of 78 1/2 was up 1 1/2 and U. S. Steel gained more than a point.

Copper shares had the best market for several days with gains ranging to more than a point in Phelps Dodge. Cils picked up on further reductions of gasoline inventories and prospect of demand for supplies for government storage in the defense plan.

Chemicals, another war group, were at gains ranging to nearly 3 points in Dow. U. S. Gypsum gained 3 points and Johns-Manville more than a point. Gains of a point and more were noted in United Aircraft, Lockheed and Glenn Martin.

Automobile Equipment issues joined motor shares in higher territory. Electric Auto-Lite was up 2.

Increasing use of electricity aided utilities. Commonwealth & Southern preferred gained nearly 2 points.

Loft, the most active issue, gained a point. Prices held at or near the highs as the close approached with volume light. Dow Jones preliminary closing stock averages: Industrial, 125.07, up 1.50; rail, 26.79, up 0.21; utility, 21.97, up 0.25; 65 stocks, 42.37, up 0.39.
