ROBBER CLAIMS NO SHOOTING NEEDED

Says Lampro Hit While Hands Were in Air

Portland, Dec. 21 (AP)—George B. Lampro, 24, was shot in the back by a police officer when he had his hands in the air and had made no move to lower them. Loyal D. McCready, 47, California ex-convict charged with bank robbery, told reporters today.

Lampro was shot by police who stopped the youth's car after it was commandeered by McCready during a getaway attempt after robbery of the Union avenue branch of the United States National bank. Lampro was innocently involved.

"I have no reason for telling anything but the truth now," McCready said. "But that young fellow never should have been shot. He kept his hands in the air all the time after being stopped by the cops and never once acted like he was grabbing for a gun."

McCready also said Lieutenant Orville Williams shot him through the hand when his arms were raised and his gun resting in his lap.

McCready was arraigned before U. S. Commissioner Kenneth F. Frazer, waived preliminary hearing and was ordered held under \$25,000 bail on two counts, one of bank holdup and the other abduction of Lampro.

Meanwhile Lampro showed improvement and hospital attendants said that, barring complications, he was expected to live. He was suffering from an abdominal gunshot wound. The revolver bullet pierced his intestines and kidney.

Three blood transfusions were given him, one by W. L. Edwards, the patrolman who shot him. Mayor Joseph K. Carson, Jr., visited Lampro and expressed regrets over the shooting.
