

BEAVERS AND HUSKIES LEAD

Oregon Biggest Flop Of Week

W. S. C. Takes Saturday Night Contest at Eugene 55-40

Seattle, Jan. 13 (AP)—Oregon State college and the University of Washington—two traditional basketball powers in the Pacific Coast conference—shared top billing today after the first week of northern division play.

Each has a record of two victories, no defeats. The Beavers smartly trounced Washington State college, while Coach Clarence (Hee) Edmondson's speed-burning Huskies took a pair of close decisions from the strongest Idaho team in the past decade.

To the University of Oregon cagers went the dubious distinction of providing the biggest flop of the week-old campaign. Washington State came back to thump the favored Webfoot twice in a row.

Otherwise the "surprise" team of the week was Idaho, whose coach, Forest Twogood, had just resigned under net-too-clear circumstances.

The Washington Huskies, with probably the fastest team in the division, won 45-43 Friday night and experienced more trouble the following night before pulling out a 39-37 overtime victory.

Washington State dumped Oregon Saturday night, 55-40 after winning the series opener 48-39. Paul Lindeman, towering Cougar center, rang up 15 points to become the league's individual scoring leader with a total of 41 points in four games.

This week's schedule: Friday—Oregon vs. Oregon State at Corvallis. Saturday—Washington State vs. Idaho at Moscow.

Stanford Men to Be Given Wrist Watches

Stanford University, Cal., Jan. 13 (AP)—Forty-seven members of the Stanford university football squad will receive wrist watches from the board of athletic control for participation in the Rose bowl game. It was announced today.

The board voted \$1,100 to buy the watches for the squad members and football managers at a meeting last night. It also appropriated \$75,000 to repair athletic equipment, including the stadium, and restored pay cuts totaling \$2,500 annually to several employees.

McLemore's Sport Parade

Tijuana, Mex., Jan. 13 (AP)—This is the home of the Agua Caliente race track, and you can get more action here with a \$2 bill than a kitten in a yarn factory. The horses run but once a week, on Sunday, but you can make more different kinds of bets on this one day than you could at any other track in a year. The operators of Agua Caliente don't hand you that eye-wash about the improvement of the breed. They are frankly out for the improvement of the better. They have provided every known means of wagering on the thoroughbred, and to make sure that the bettors have time to make the rounds, they sometimes run as many as 16 races, starting in the morning and running throughout the afternoon after a brief pause for lunch.

Agua Caliente has the regular parimutuels, to start with. If you are one of those horse players who object to the public making your odds, the bookies are right there in the palatial public rooms to serve you. All sorts of bookies, too. Besides the regular books, Agua Caliente furnishes foreign books, future books, combination or parlay books, and books that will accept wagers on fourth place horses.

The foreign books handle bets on horses running at any of the American tracks. You can figure out something good at Hialeah or Santa Anita and your wager will be gladly accepted. The future book is one of the biggest in the country, and right now its operators are concerned with the coming Santa Anita \$100,000 handicap. Just for your information, Charley Howard is playing Mioland, and heavy, and has yet to get anything down on his Kayak II. Around here the feeling is that Howard may shoot with Mioland in the \$100,000 event and ship Kayak to Florida for a shot at the Widener stake.

The combination books handle any and all parlays. No one has yet figured out a combination bet they won't handle. Agua Caliente features the daily double and the quinella. The double involves the winner of the first and third races, and the quinella provides a medium for attempting to pick the first and second horses to cross the finish line in the ninth race.

Caliente also has a big prize contest each Sunday. Before the races start the customers mark their programs and anyone picking seven winners, third to ninth inclusive, gets \$1,000 cash. If no one picks seven winners, \$500 is given away at a drawing after the last race, and \$500 is put into a kitty that is allowed to sweeten until it reaches \$5,000. Then the \$5,000 is offered to the man, woman, or child who can pick seven winners. Is no one does, the whole shebang is given away at a drawing.

Racing starts at 11 in the morning and the last race isn't run until near sundown. During the luncheon period the customers are entertained by a big outdoor Mexican floor show, trapeze acts, and what have you. Caliente also is the only track that features races in which women jockeys ride against the men.

You'd like it down here. Why not pack the family in the car and drive down the next clear Sunday. It's only three or four thousand miles from nearly any place you can name.

In the final quarter, however, the visitors sank six field goals and the Panthers failed to connect for one.

Saturday's game was distinguished by a scoreless second quarter, with the score static at 12 for Sweet Home and 11 for Redmond. The Panthers won the game with a third quarter spurt when they swished the ball through the hoop for nine field goals to their opponents' three. Each team scored once in the final period.

Oakland, Cal., Jan. 13 (AP)—The first three prizes of \$1,200, \$750 and \$530 in the \$5,000 Oakland open golf tournament will be awarded today after the 18-hole playoff between Ben Hogan of New York, Dutch Harrison of Little Rock, Ark., and Leonard Dodson of Kansas City.

Hogan, who set a new P. G. A. competitive record with a spectacular, eight-under-par 62 Saturday, had a wide-open chance to take the \$1,200 top money yesterday but missed a two-foot putt on the 18th green to slide into a tie with Harrison and Dodson with a total of 276 for the 72 holes, four strokes under par.

Fourth money of \$450 went to Harry Cooper of Chicopee, Mass., with 279. Mark Fry, home course pro, and Jimmy Hines of Great Neck, N. Y., registered even par 280s and collected \$325 each.

Bud Ward of Spokane, former national amateur champion, was low amateur with 282. He tied with professionals Jimmy Demaret of Houston, Texas, defending champion; Jug McSpaden of Winchester, Mass., and Fred Wood of Vancouver, B. C.

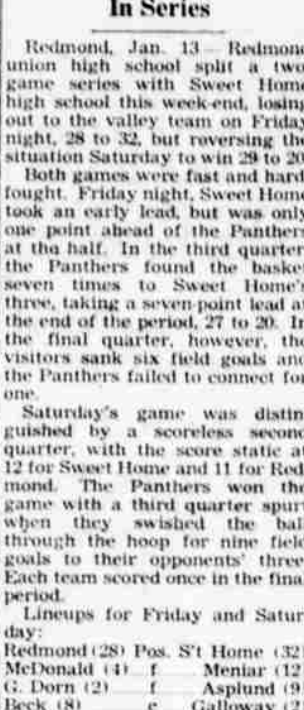
