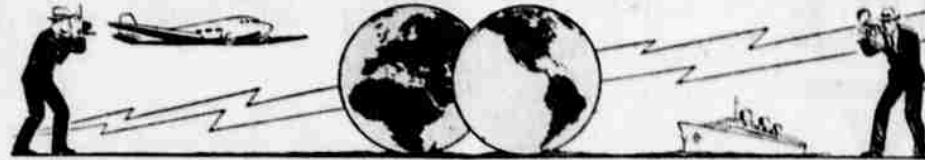

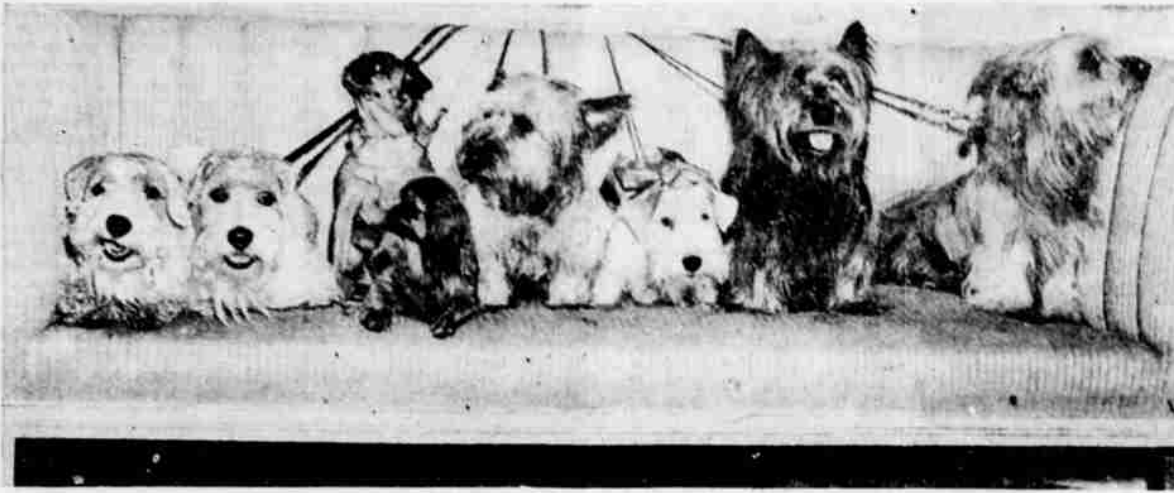

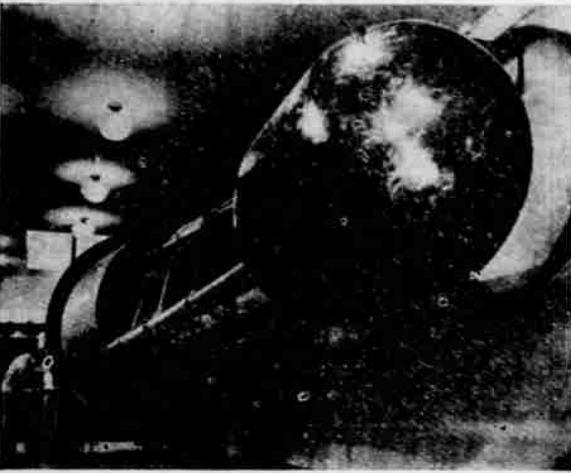

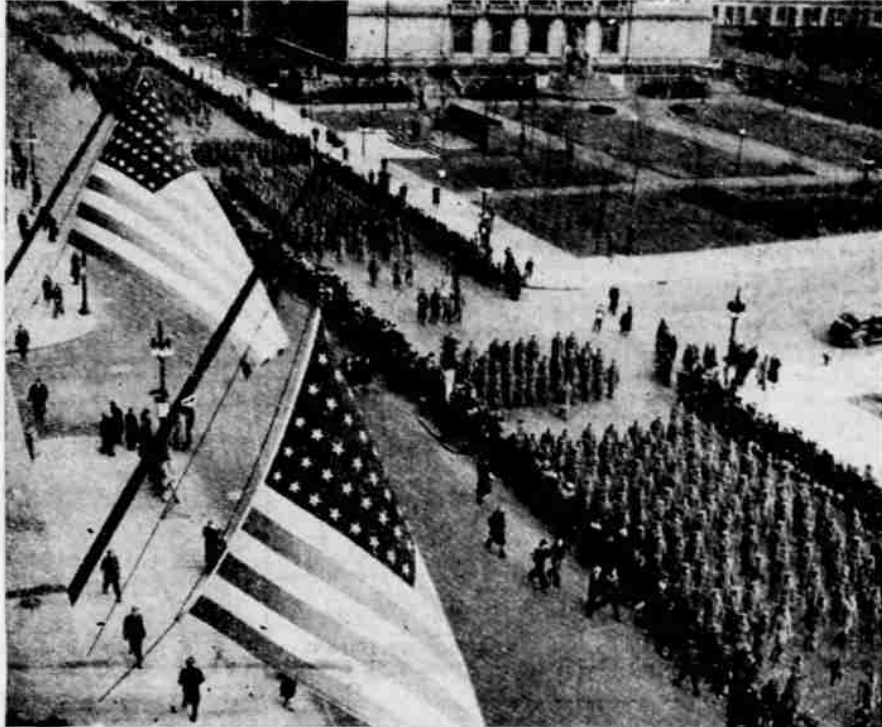
TAKE YOUR PICK—"Calling all dogs" party held in New York under the auspices of American French War Relief Society, found dogs of all classes and breeds vying for honors.

Stable for Students' Horses Hope of Group

Corvallis (Special)—A stable for student-owned saddle horses at Oregon State college, which would enable some of the boys from the wide open spaces of eastern Oregon to keep their horses with them, is the goal of a combined effort by the Agricultural club and the Withycombe club at O. S. C.

The plan has the backing of the school of agriculture as it would provide a group of light-weight horses on the campus for use in judging and other instructional purposes. Since the removal of the

cavalry unit of the R. O. T. C. no such group of saddle animals has been available.

Three Drivers Cited On No-License Charge

Three drivers of cars involved in accidents in Bend on March 19 were cited to appear in court on charges of operating automobiles without permits, data on file in the local police station show. Two different accidents occurred, and only one operator of the four machines involved was found to have a license, police report.

Kenneth L. Stevens, of Sisters,

whose car was involved in an accident with a machine driven by Earl Abbott, left the scene of the accident and was not located until later.

Arrested following a chase by police in downtown Bend, Stevens, on his plea of guilty, was fined \$25 and given a 10-day jail sentence. Abbott had an operator's permit.

Elsie C. Johnson and Bette V. Johnson, drivers of cars involved in an intersection accident at Wall

and Bond Wednesday evening, were each cited on charges of operating cars without permits.

Elsie C. Johnson was fined \$250 on her plea of guilty. Bette V. Johnson was to appear in court this evening.

It is the practice of officers to ask all persons involved in accidents to show their drivers' permits.

Demonstration Agent To Go to McMinnville

Mrs. Sara H. Wertz, who has been Deschutes county home demonstration agent for the past five years, will leave March 31 for McMinnville where she will be home management supervisor for the farm security administration for Polk and Yamhill counties. It was announced today by Verne Livesey, state director for the F. S. A. Mrs. Wertz came to Bend in

January, 1936, from Grants Pass, where she was Josephine county home demonstration agent for 11 years.

Prior to that time she taught in high school for two years. In 1938-39, Mrs. Wertz took a year's leave of absence and attended Cornell university, where she earned her master's degree in household management.

No successor to Mrs. Wertz here has been officially named yet.
