

CIVIL SERVICE GIRL MISSING

Left Oregon Only Few Days Ago

Disappears After Working Two Days at Job in War Department

Washington, March 21 (AP)—A "very pretty" government clerk who worked two days on war department maps and then disappeared was sought today by local police and army intelligence officers.

Ruth Egoscue of Forest Grove, Ore., 22-year-old typist, arrived here from the Pacific coast Saturday, started work on a new job Monday and has been missing since Wednesday morning.

Her landlady, one of the last to see her, said the girl was a stranger in the city and had few acquaintances. But according to her Miss Egoscue had a date with a "navy man" Tuesday night.

At the rooming house where she had lived since last Saturday, Miss Egoscue had complained of the work on army air corps maps assigned to her. She preferred typing, the work she had expected to do.

Army intelligence officials furnished her picture and description to police and were cooperating with them in an attempt to reach her relatives or friends in Oregon. They described her as a "very pretty" brunette, with brown wavy hair and weighing about 115 pounds.

Mrs. James Beal, landlady at the rooming house, said Miss Egoscue complained of not feeling well Wednesday morning and decided not to walk to work with other girls living there. She left the house about 8 a. m., presumably to take a bus or trolley to her office. Her superiors at the war department said she did not report to work.

Her room, officers said, was undisturbed. Her belongings, including luggage and clothing were intact.

Forest Grove, March 21 (AP)—The mother of Ruth Egoscue, pretty typist who disappeared from a war department job in Washington, D. C., said today she believed her daughter may be suffering from amnesia.

mysteriously last fall from her job as typist at the Forest Grove high school. The girl returned a few days later, unharmed.

Miss Egoscue apparently was happy and normal on her return, but she refused to discuss her whereabouts with anyone and apparently had no memory of where she had been, her mother said.

An airmail letter written by the girl Tuesday night arrived in Garibaldi yesterday and was being forwarded to Mrs. Egoscue in Forest Grove. She hoped it would contain some clue to the young woman's disappearance.

Miss Egoscue took a civil service examination five months ago to obtain a job in Washington. She left Forest Grove last week and arrived in Washington, D. C., Saturday morning.

While in Washington, she has been staying with Doris Nolan, another government clerk who formerly resided in Forest Grove.

The girl was known to be exceptionally bright and of excellent character and reputation.
