New York, April 21 (U.P.)—The stock list eased today to new lows since last June 10 on adverse war developments and another decline in steel operations caused by the coal strike. Trading was light.

Dozens of leading issues made new lows for the year or longer although losses were small and in many instances part of the decline was recovered.

Rails made the best showing. Utilities made new lows or equalled the lows of the year. Leading steel and automobile shares made new lows. Coppers and mercan-

tiles held well. Aircrafts were dull with prices irregular. Mining stocks, aside from coppers, were at new lows, with one point loss in Homestake and Howe Sound.

Midland Steel Products preferred lost 5 points and National Biscuit preferred was down 2 points. Losses of a point and more were made by Allied Chemical, Bethlehem Steel, Coca Cola, Dow Chemical, Monsanto Chemical, Penn Dixie Cement preferred, Radio Corporation preferred, United Engineering & Foundry, U. S. Rubber preferred and U. S. Steel preferred.

Among issues to show small gains were Du Pont and General Electric, which earlier were at their lows for the year.

New lows were made by U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, Chrysler, General Motors, Westinghouse Electric, Lockheed, Bendix, Boeing, Continental Can, Allis Chalmers and Commonwealth Edison. Some rallied.

Dow Jones preliminary closing stock averages: Industrial, 116.06, off 0.09; rail, 27.77, up 0.05; utility, 18.10, off 0.07; and 65 stocks, 39.68, off 0.02.

Stock sales approximated 430,000 shares against 490,000 Friday. Crab stock sales were 74,000 shares compared with 99,000 in the previous five-hour session.

BOSTON WOOL
Boston, April 21 (U.P.)—New business was very slow in the Boston wool market, the U. S. agriculture department reported today. Only a few inquiries were being received. These were mostly for fine original bag, territory wools, the 1/4 and 1/2 blood grades of fleeces, and various grades of South American wool.

The lack of offering of 1/4 and 1/2 blood fleeces wool was stimulating inquiries for similar grades of spot South American wool. Quotations on domestic and foreign wool were unchanged compared with the close of last week.
