LEADING STOCK ISSUES LOWER

Steel Production Hits 100 Per Cent Mark

German Activities in Crete Principal Weakening Factor

MARKETS AT A GLANCE

Stocks firm in moderate trading. Bonds irregularly higher. Curb stocks irregular. Wheat up 1/2 cent a bushel; corn 1/4 higher with July and September deliveries at best levels since 1937; soy beans at 4-year high. Cotton up as much as 55 cents a bale. Rubber firm. Silver in New York unchanged.

New York, May 21 (AP)—Leading stocks sagged in late profit-taking today after an early rise. German activities in Crete were considered the principal factor in slowing the advance since most domestic news was favorable.

Steel shares sagged fractions. Steel news today included an authoritative estimate that the principal producer, U. S. Steel, was operating at 100 per cent of capacity, equaling the record high established in January. Coppers were active with prices mixed. Oil issues were the most active as a group. Consolidated Oil, Ohio Oil, Standard Oil of Ohio, Texas Corporation and Texas Pacific Land Trust, made new highs for the year.

Railroad issues encountered some profit-taking by traders who feared ill effects of labor demands for higher wages. Losses were relatively small. Utilities also eased on the average. American Telephone rose more than a point when directors announced they had recommended flotation of a debenture issue of \$234,000,000 for construction purposes. This issue, if stockholders authorize it at a special meeting June 25, will provide valuable rights for present holders of the stock.

Some mercantile issues were higher on improved trade reports. Farm issues continued to rise on anticipation of heavier business resulting from higher parity payments. J. I. Case gained 2 points. Dow Jones preliminary closing stock averages: Industrial 117.82, up 0.17, rail 28.12 off 0.13, utility 17.25 off 0.06, 65 stocks 40.00 off 0.02.

Stock sales approximated 340,000 shares against 470,000 yesterday. Curb stock sales were 78,000 shares against 100,000 yesterday.

BOSTON WOOL

Boston, May 21 (AP)—Combing % blood territory wools were receiving some demand at prices ranging mostly 90 to 93c scoured basis, the U. S. agriculture department reported today.

Declines for the finer territory wools have resulted in a few sales of moderate volume at around \$1.05 scoured basis for graded fine containing staple and French combing lengths together at 97c to \$1.00 scoured basis. Original bags fine territory had a little demand at \$1 to \$1.03 scoured basis.
