Market Shows Irregular Trend In Late Trading

Demands so Unlimited That Some Issues Are Listed as "Untraded"

MARKETS AT A GLANCE

Stocks irregularly higher in dull trading. Bonds irregular; rails strong. Curb stocks irregular. Wheat up 1/4 to 1/2 cent a bushel; corn 1/2 to 1/4 cent higher. Cotton up as much as 25 cents a bale.

New York, June 21 (UP)—The stock market made an irregular advance today with trading dull. Demand was so limited that some leading issues were untraded. Others only came out in small lots. Large volume was in Southern Pacific and Socony-Vacuum, which held at the previous closing levels. Steel shares were better on outlook for a steel operating rate just under 100 per cent of capacity. Coppers were narrowly irregular. Utilities held around the previous close while rails were steady to firm.

A few issues had wide changes. American Airlines lost nearly 4 points, while Vulcan Detinning Preferred gained 4 points to a new high. J. I. Case opened at 60, off 2 1/2, and failed to make another appearance. McEllan Stores gained 3 1/2 points on a single sale. Thompson-Starrett Preferred was off more than a point.

Armour Preferred rose more than a point. Small gains were noted in American Smelting, Consolidated Aircraft, Santa Fe, Dow Chemical, Douglas Aircraft, International Nickel, Kennecott, Procter & Gamble, Sears Roebuck, Standard Oil (N. J.), Union Carbide and Woolworth.

Dow Jones closing stock averages: Industrial, 11,222.51, up 0.32; rail, 27.99, up 0.06; utility, 17.75, off 0.02; and 65 stocks, 41.17, up 0.09.

Stock sales approximated 130,000 shares, the smallest short session turnover since May 31, and compared with 190,000 a week ago. Curb stock sales were 27,000 shares against 36,000 last Saturday.

BOSTON WOOL
Boston, June 21 (UP)—Interest in domestic wools increased somewhat in Boston this week, the U. S. agriculture department reported today.

Much of the interest was for wool suitable for government orders. Sales of a few grades of territory wools were slightly broader than in the previous week. Prices were unchanged. Demand tended to slacken on the finer grades of foreign wools. The fine grades of bright fleeces were inactive at 42 to 44 cents in the grease quoted on fine delaine and at 43 to 45 cents in the grease on combing half blood.

Scattered sales were closed on bright 3/4 and 1/2 blood fleeces at 46 to 48 cents in the grease.

PORTLAND PRODUCE
Portland, June 21 (UP)—Butter and eggs were unchanged. An improved tone in country dressed meats was shown. Virtually all classes of poultry are in active call and prices are fully steady.
