

### Main Stock List Moves Within Narrow Range

Dozen or So Issues Register Gains of From Two to Seven Points

By Elmer C. Walzer (United Press Financial Editor) New York, Aug. 21 (U.P.)—The main list of stocks moved in a narrowly irregular way today while a dozen or so special issues registered gains of 2 to 7 points. Trading lightened from yesterday's pace.

The list extended yesterday's gains in the early trading but slipped back later. New highs were made by such issues as United Stores preferred, U. S. Leather prior preferred, New York City Omnibus preferred and Central Violeta Sugar. Several other sugar shares followed the latter into higher ground.

Gains of 2 to 3 points were noted in Sloss Sheffield, General Baking preferred and General Steel Castings preferred. Advances of a point and more were noted in Commercial Investment Trust, In-Term-Chemical preferred, Mullins Manufacturing preferred, Jewel Tea, and Mesta Machine.

Steel shares moved over a narrow area and late in the session were about unchanged on balance. Railroad issues were steady to slightly easier despite a rise in car loadings.
