

Active Market Sends Stocks Up

New York, Nov. 21 (AP)—Stocks moved irregularly higher in moderately active dealings today.

The list was aided by a last-hour rally which lifted leading shares, particularly steel and rails by fractions to more than a point. Specialties were in keen demand most of the session and some scored wide advances.

Trading was fairly active.

Brokers attributed the improvement to increasing hopes that a railroad strike will be averted and to rumors that President Roosevelt soon will force a showdown in the captive coal mine strike.

News generally was favorable. The Far Eastern situation appeared no worse, the British reported success in a wide drive into Libya and trade news was favorable.

Carloadings for the Nov. 15 week were up contrasessionally; the federal reserve board reported its October production index at a new high of 164 per cent of the 1935-38 average, up 3 points over September; and there was a long list of favorable dividend actions.

Legion Meeting Is Postponed

Melvin Gillett, commander of the Percy A. Stevens post of the American Legion, received word today that the district convention of the legion, originally planned for Redmond on November 27, has been indefinitely postponed.

Reason for the postponement was not learned here, but it is known that Joseph Carson, state commander of the legion, has been called east. Carson was to attend the Redmond meeting.

CCC Enrollees Arrive at Camps

Redmond, Nov. 21—New enrollees for Camp Redmond and Camp Wickiup rolled into Redmond last night on a special train which arrived here about 6 p. m. The Camp Redmond replacements numbered 104, and about 90 for Wickiup were also aboard.

Lieutenant Raymond S. Wise, commander of company 569 at Camp Redmond, said the new boys, most of them from Kentucky and Indiana, will be ready to go to work on the North Unit project Monday, with the exception of those who will be assigned to Camp duties. The boys will complete their orientation program this weekend.

Work on the North unit canal will be much accelerated Monday when the new crews report for duty. Four crews will probably begin work, explained J. F. Blanchard, camp superintendent; they will include a jack-hammer crew, powder crew, clearing crew, and one on bridges and culverts.

As heavy equipment arrives from Wickiup, the trained CCC operators who have been using it will be sent to Camp Redmond, so that new boys can be assigned to less technical tasks. Training of part of the new enrollees in use of equipment will begin at once as part of the educational program. It is expected that all heavy equipment will be transferred to Redmond by December 1, and the district defense school in heavy equipment operation will be moved to Camp Redmond at that time.

New enrollees arrived in Redmond replete with a bountiful Thanksgiving feast which had been served them on the train. Enrollees at Camp Redmond had their usual roast turkey feast Thursday, in observance of the holiday.
