

Central Oregon Track Teams To Compete Here

Warm-Up Meet Set for April 3 at Bend; Eight Schools Invited

Bend high school will be host Friday, April 3, to track teams from Central Oregon high schools in an early season "warm-up" meet.

Each school will be permitted three entries in each event. While times and distances are expected to be poor in such an early meet it should do much toward arousing interest in track activity in Central Oregon this year.

Invitations have been issued to all Central Oregon schools. Redmond, Dufur, and Sisters have already notified Bend school officials that they will have teams here for the meet. It is hoped that Prineville, Madras, Lapine, Gilchrist and Culver will also be able to send entrants.

One of the purposes of the meet is to give the smaller schools of the area an opportunity to take part. It is usually difficult for them to field full teams for dual meets. In this meet the outstanding boys in the smaller schools will have a chance to make names for themselves.

As both Bend and Redmond are shy of veterans, the field is practically wide open in nearly all events.

Three Teams Lead In Fight Tourney

Stanford Meets Colorado Five

Western Title Is at Stake; Cards Beat Rice, Kansas Dumped

Kansas City, March 21 (AP)—Colorado and Stanford, western finalists, meet tonight for the right to contest for the national collegiate basketball title. The winner will play the eastern champion—Kentucky or Dartmouth—for the NCCA championship here March 28.

Wolcott Breaks Hurdle Record

Chicago, March 21 (AP)—Freddie Wolcott of Rice flashed his jack-rabbit heels at the field in three hurdle events at the sixth annual Chicago relays to better on world's record and equal two others.

Stealing the spotlight from Cornelius Warmerdam, who broke the meet record but failed to better his own world's record in the pole vault, Wolcott made a sweep of the hurdle races before a crowd of 16,000 at the midwest's outstanding track carnival last night.

The lanky Texan established a new world's indoor mark in the 40-yard high hurdles when he went over the timbers in five seconds flat, to break a mark set here in 1939 by Alan Tolmich of Wayne university. He equalled his own world's record of 6.1 seconds in the 50-yard high hurdles and 7.2 seconds in the 60-yard high.

Warmerdam, former Fresno State college, Cal. star, established a new meet record when he won the pole vault with a leap of 15 feet two inches.
