

Stocks Advance To High Levels

MARKETS AT A GLANCE (By United Press) Stocks strong and active. Bonds higher; U. S. government's irregularly lower.

United Press Financial Editor) New York, Jan. 21 (AP)—Stocks advanced today to around the best levels in more than a year with the highest grade issues in demand.

Leading automobile issues—Chrysler and General Motors made new highs for 1942-43. Steels were strong and active with the leaders up a point and more.

Coppers moved up under the lead of Kennecott, which gained nearly a point. Gold miners were featured by homestake which gained nearly a point.

American Telephone lost nearly a point, but other communications were active with prices firm. Gains in the preferred stocks ranged to more than two points in American and foreign power 6 per cent stock.

Chemicals were strong with gains of a point and more in Allied, Eastman Kodak and Du Pont. Air Reduction and Union Carbide gained fractionally.

Civilian Economy Trim Near End

Washington, Jan. 21 (AP)—War Production Chairman Donald M. Nelson said today very little more can be trimmed from the civilian economy under the war effort, and that some experts believe it already has been trimmed too heavily.

Nelson said at a press conference that the four most important problems now facing his agency are: 1. Increased production of valves, heat exchangers (cooling devices), and other parts of war weapons.

2. Proper distribution of available materials to assure expanded production of these parts. 3. Simplification of consumer goods.

4. Concentration of industry. Trimming Nears End Nelson said little additional material could be saved for the war effort through a further curtailment of civilian economy.

"Is there a feeling among some officials of WPB that you already have trimmed civilian needs too much?" he was asked. "Yes," he replied. "What are your feelings in the matter?"

"I have no evidence yet to show that we have trimmed too far," he replied. "On the other hand, I feel that not much more trimming can be done which would save a substantial amount of materials for the war effort."

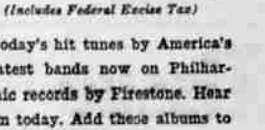

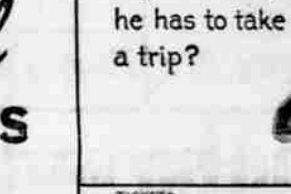

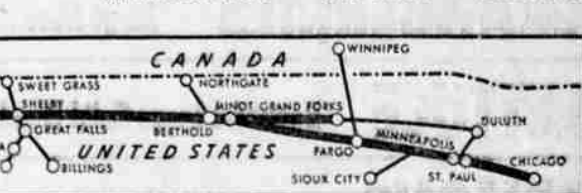
