

Stocks React to Mexican Visit

By Elmer C. Walzer (United Press Financial Editor) New York, April 21 (AP)—Security markets reacted favorably to day to President Roosevelt's Mexican visit. Stocks advanced fractions to more than a point on increased volume with the utility average in new high ground since April 5, 1941, while Latin American bonds featured the bond section.

Mexican bonds, long defaulted, were bid up and other Latin American issues joined the rise. The feature of the stock section was the improved demand for high grade stocks, American Telephone, for example, moved up to a new high as Walter S. Gifford, president, told stockholders at the annual meeting that the company had more business than it could handle with present facilities.

General Motors advanced more than a point to feature a strong market for the automobile shares. The issue was fairly active. Chrysler rose nearly a point in moderate turnover.
