New Director and Associate Of USO to Arrive Here Soon

Titus Described as "Commando" Who Cleared Way for Staff; Bend People Give Much Aid
"The commando landed and with whirlwind tactics took over—preparing the way for the army of occupation."

Titus, whose title "area director" means doing just what he did here, was notified by the National Catholic Community Service on May 1 that he was to come to Bend and set up USO operations until the arrival of the permanent director.

But the four days prior to that first 7 p. m. coffee-sipping will never be forgot by either Titus nor the public-minded Bendites who aided him.

People Give Aid
"I'll never forget the people of Bend and the way they worked for the boys that week and since," Titus said Thursday.

At no time in the discussion by the legionnaires, it was stated, was any rabid or other anti-Japanese sentiment expressed towards the loyal Japanese Americans.

Post Commander Robert E. Burligh requested Adjutant George R. Brick, and Chaplain John B. Coan to complete the questionnaire according to the vote on each question and to add thereon the reasons as stated above.
