

Railroad Issues Reported Firm

New York, May 21 (U.P.)—Railroad issues developed a firmer tone in late trading today to feature a quiet, irregular stock market.

Union Pacific started more than 3 points to a new high in early recognition of a favorable report for the first four months and its other issues which came back strength had a good influence on from early lows in most instances. Santa Fe rallied a point from its low.

Profit taking brought many declines, while selective buying aided some special issues.

Leading shares were quiet, greatest volume centered on low-priced shares, including Commonwealth & Southern, American Light & Electric Power & Light, Erie Electric, International Telephone, and Socony Vacuum.

Morvante stocks were steadied by the weekly Dun & Bradstreet trade review showing retail sales this week at levels 7 to 14 percent over the corresponding week of last year.

Enforcement of the ordinance has not been necessary until this week, Drost pointed out, because of the cold weather that prevailed in April and the early part of the month. However, this week irrigation has drawn heavily on the system.

No city water facilities are large enough to take care of the turning on of all outlets at the same time, Drost said, and some arrangement is necessary to divide the use so that adequate water pressure for fire protection can be maintained at all times. Even in the driest seasons of the year, the Bend ordinance makes it possible for all water users to have sufficient water and water pressure to keep their gardens and lawns in condition, he said.

The ordinance provides a maximum fine of \$10 for violation.
