

Webfoots Meet Huskies Tonight

Eugene, Jan. 21 (AP)—Although they haven't shown much improvement in practice this week, University of Oregon Webfoots are determined to even the score with University of Washington Huskies here tonight for the double deaft suffered in Seattle two weeks ago—40-38 and 67-25.

Despite their 52-33 victory over OSC here last Saturday, the Webfoots are worried about the two-game northern division series with the Huskies tonight and tomorrow.

Reports from Seattle indicate Coach Hec Edmundson will have all his civilian guns aimed at the Oregon hoopers. Nine will make up the traveling squad, with Ronald Haug, a fleet-footed sure-shot, and Jim Mallory, forwards; Jack Nichols, center; and Al Mar and Johnny Codd or Don O'Neil, guards, as probable starters. Pat Sutherland, center, Hal Robinson, guard, and Jim Peterson, forward, also will make the trip.

Conference regulations allow one more player, and if it is Bill Morris, all-American, guard on last year's coast championship club, now a marine trainee, at least one victory for the Huskies would be a cinch.

Hoopster Rest Hit by Allen

Lawrence, Kan., Jan. 21 (AP)—"Penalty box" basketball, to be tried experimentally tonight between DePaul and Marquette at Chicago, simply will "provide a fair rest period for a rough player to go back fresh for another tussle," Dr. Forrest C. (Phog) Allen, coach of the University of Kansas team, charged today.

The plan, brainchild of Bill Chandler, Marquette coach, calls for three minute benchings for players after the fourth foul is committed, with similar penalties for every infraction committed thereafter. "There is nothing new about it anyway," Allen said. "It was a part of basketball in its founding days. When a man fouled then, however, no substitute went in for him, the rule being the same as the present day hockey regulations against mayhem."

CUBA LIKES BASEBALL. Atlanta, Ga., Jan. 21 (AP)—Earl Mann, president of the Atlanta Crackers, who went on a "man hunt" in Cuba for players, reported today that he never had seen so much baseball played as on the island. "And it is good baseball, too," he said. "It certainly is the national game there."

Baseball Future Bright—Rickey

New York, Jan. 21 (AP)—Branch Rickey is confident of baseball's future despite wartime uncertainties, but he is sad to learn that the double-A minor leagues have a similar faith in the ability of the sport to withstand further losses in manpower.

"They'll do all right, too, if players remain available," the Brooklyn president told his weekly press conference yesterday. "As far as the majors are concerned, I can't find any reason at all to doubt their going ahead, regardless of what happens in the minors."

KLEPPER HAILS ROWLAND

Portland, Jan. 21 (AP)—Bill Klepper, business manager of the Portland Beavers just returned from the annual meeting of Pacific coast baseball league bigwigs in Sacramento, said today the coast league magnates were looking forward to big things. Chicago, Jan. 21 (AP)—Betty Hicks, one of the nation's leading feminine golfers, today recommended the formation of a women's professional golfers' association.

Miss Hicks, currently a member of the Spars, said the women's PGA should hold meets concurrently with the regular PGA tournaments and have regular seasonal tours.

The purpose of her plan is twofold, she said. First, it would promote golfing among women, and second, it would provide a wide-range, representative program of tournaments with adequate prizes for the women pros.

University of Georgia Hits at Football Fine

Lexington, Ky., Jan. 21 (AP)—Officials of the southeastern conference said today that the University of Georgia had appealed a \$500 fine levied for alleged use of ineligible football players and that the school would be given a hearing at the spring meeting of faculty representatives.

The unprecedented disciplinary measure was announced yesterday by Dr. F. C. Funkhouser, conference secretary, who said the conference investigation disclosed "flagrant violation of the rules in spite of definite advice to the contrary by the conference commissioner, M. S. O'Connor."
