

# Rail Shares Boom Market

New York, Jan. 21 (UP)—Strength and activity in the rail shares and gains ranging to five points in special issues featured a moderately active stock market session today.

In the carrier group, Southern Pacific and New York Central, each with fractional gains, featured the turnover. Mahoning Valley railroad spurred 6 1/2 points on a single 10-share lot sale. Small gains were noted in such stocks as Southern Railway, Morris and Essex, Northern Pacific, Pennsylvania, Great Northern preferred, Delaware and Hudson; Delaware, Lackawanna and Western, and Atlantic Coast Line. Santa Fe was active and up more than a point.

Outlook for heavy passenger business after the war aided the carriers. Budd Manufacturing issues were again strong spots on outlook for big business from the railroads after the war. Other rail equipments were firm.

Engineers Public Service featured the market in turnover and made a new high. Other utilities were steady to firm.

**PORTLAND PRODUCE**  
Portland, Jan. 21 (UP)—An almost total lack of cheese for the civilian trade had dealers worried today, with no apparent relief in sight.

The poultry trade was strong on the Portland dairy market, with live and dressed stock selling at full ceilings.

Inadequate supplies continued for butter, with the make showing no improvement.

The egg trade was confused, reportedly from a government tendency to require federal inspection before the grade "AA" can be used. Most egg producers have been doing their own grading under Oregon laws.

## Diplomat's Wife Slain in Chicago

Chicago, Jan. 21 (UP)—Detectives thumbed through the gill-edged registry of the Drake hotel today in a search for a guest who might have been the slayer of Mrs. Adele Born Williams, 55, wealthy wife of a state department attaché, who was shot in her room overlooking Lake Michigan.

The theory that the killer may have been a guest of the fashionable hotel was strengthened by Mrs. Hugh McBirney, a prominent

member of Chicago society. She told police she saw a woman wearing a Persian lamb coat and a gaily decorated hat lurching in the Camella room of the Drake Wednesday, several hours before the shooting. Mrs. McBirney said the woman answered the description given of the slayer by Mrs. Williams' daughter, who witnessed the shooting.
